**2012 CONVENTION TOURS**

**THURSDAY, JUNE 21 KAPPA GUYS TOUR TENNESSEE RIVER GORGE EXCURSION CRUISE**

Board the River Gorge Explorer at the Chattanooga Riverboat Pier for a 2 hour, 26 mile scenic tour of 27,000 acres of protected land. We will walk to the Tennessee Aquarium to enjoy a box lunch and tour the freshwater and saltwater exhibits. We will also visit *The Passage*, a new pedestrian link between downtown Chattanooga and the Tennessee River.

**THURSDAY, JUNE 21 CHATTANOOGA DUCKS CITY TOUR AND TENNESSEE AQUARIUM (1/2 day tour)**

Kappas, kids, and guests will board an authentic WWII amphibious landing craft built specifically for the D-Day Invasion. The tour will take you through downtown Chattanooga before splashing into the Tennessee River at Ross' Landing. We will walk to the aquarium to visit the River Journey and Ocean Journey facilities. We will also visit *The Passage* located on the Trail of Tears at Ross' Landing.

**THURSDAY, JUNE 21 SOUTHERN BELLE 3-HOUR DINNER CRUISE & ENTERTAINMENT**

A special night is in store for all Kappas as you relax and enjoy the climate-controlled Southern Belle 3-hour Dinner Cruise. History unfolds in a unique manner during the Sightseeing Cruise. A special dinner menu has been prepared for Kappa, and you will enjoy the toe-tapping music. A cash-bar is also available. Dress is comfortable and casual.

**FRIDAY, JUNE 22 LOOKOUT MOUNTAIN INCLINE (Option 1 — 1/2 day tour)**

The thrill of riding 'America's Most amazing Mile' has delighted guests for more than a century. As trolley-style railcars on the Incline climb historic Lookout Mountain, Chattanooga's surrounding mountains and valleys come alive. The Incline Centennial exhibits depict the history of one of Chattanooga's most unusual landmarks. We will take a brief walk to the site of the Civil War battle known as "The Battle above the Clouds." The bus will take us to Rock City Gardens for lunch and the opportunity to enjoy the quiet woodland paths and gardens.

**FRIDAY, JUNE 22 BLUFF VIEW ART DISTRICT (Option 2 — 1/2 day tour)**

We will tour the Hunter Museum of American Art. The museum, comprised of a 1905 classical revival mansion and a 2005 contemporary structure, is built on a ninety-foot limestone bluff overlooking the Tennessee River. The Houston Museum of Decorative Arts is located across the street. The museum features one of the Southeast's most impressive private collections of contemporary American sculpture.

**SATURDAY, JUNE 23 ELECTRIC SHUTTLE BUS AND WALKING TOUR OF THE SOUTHSIDE**

This tour offers a little bit of something for everybody. It begins at the English Rose Tea Room, in the foyer of the original Grand Hotel built in the 1890's for a "Tea Party" just for Kappas. We will visit the Chattanooga Choo Choo to see the world's largest working "HO" gauge model railroads, ride the authentic wooden New Orleans trolley, enjoy shopping, and the beautifully landscaped gardens.

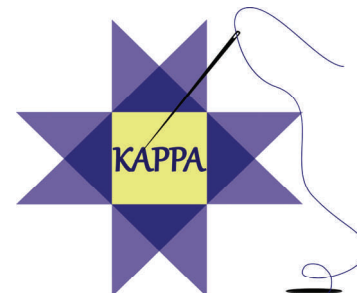

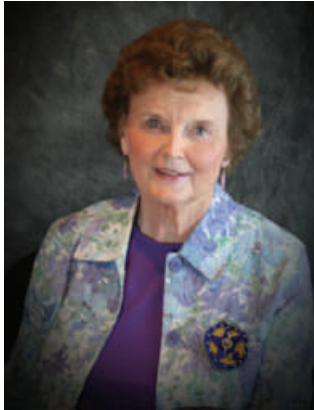
