

seem overly simplistic, but that doesn't mean they're not deeply true. In fact, I would suggest that, in addition to being perennially so, they're also once again profoundly timely and appropriate.

Furthermore, those words are consistent with Scripture and serve nicely to help me introduce our upcoming worship theme for Fall. Beginning with our September 6th "Back-To" service, we will be exploring the topic:

"The Way(s) of The World/THE WAY of Jesus".

Now, as we look at the annual "return" to "regular" church activity, this year, of course, like everything else in our world right now, will be anything but normal. And yet, we are striving to maintain as much consistency and normalcy as is safe and possible.

Right now, individual Adult Discussion Groups are still determining if/when/how they might meet. Youth Sunday School is going to resume, but will do so with new safety measures in place (the kids will have individual activity kits that are assigned to them and only them specifically, social-distancing will be implemented for children outside of the same sibling-groups, class will take place outdoors as often as the weather permits, and son).

We are altering how we will celebrate the Fall Festival and discussing alternatives to our Kids' Carnival. The Outreach Committee is likewise exploring different methods to continue our mission and ministry to the community.

In each instance, The Law of Love is driving our decision-making processes —as we seek to maintain the physical and spiritual health of our congregation and neighbors. Thus far, we have been blessed in both regards —easily and safely reengaging many of our ministries (with assorted precautions and procedures in place, and with limited in-person attendance helping to ensure people's wellbeing).

Senior High group has had safe/socially-distanced gatherings, small groups have been back for a couple of months, Wednesday Night Bible Study never stopped meeting (and even after returning to our in-person format, we still have people joining us via Zoom), Staff and Committee meetings have taken place (with all due safety protocols maintained), and more...

...We still want your suggestions on how to better reach and care for those who aren't able/comfortable being in public gatherings right now &/or don't have access to the social-media and electronic formats we've been relying upon.

And as you think and pray about that, don't forget: whenever we celebrate The Lord's Supper, we have hygienically-sealed individual Communion packets available at the church office for those who will be participating online/from home. If you want some delivered (or need anything else) don't hesitate to call, text, email, or Instant Message me.

In the days ahead, we'll all undoubtedly have to continue being creative, flexible, gracious, prayerful, and faithful, but we've made it this far, and I have no doubt we can keep it —through The Spirit's Power and with Christ's guidance!
