WILDLAND FIRE TOWNHALL SCHEDULED

Last month's wildfire townhall meeting was again very successful with a full house in attendance. There will be another meeting on Friday, February 8th at 6 PM in the Fire Station Hall to refine our plans and gather more feedback regarding Shelter Cove's wildfire preparedness and evacuation readiness. The focus of this meeting will be the announcement of a Community Chipper Day so please plan to attend to bring your thoughts and get the details on how you can take advantage of this free chipper service.

Emergency Disaster Preparedness Committee Meetings to Start:

The RID and Shelter Cove Fire Department are organizing a series of Emergency disaster planning meetings to be held in the Fire Station Meeting Hall. The regular meeting schedule will be announced at the February 8th Wildland Fire Townhall meeting noted above. The meetings will allow the community to bring ideas and knowledge to help the newly formed committee craft an Evacuation Plan among other things.

Dark Sky Protection:

If you want to be a good neighbor and reduce light pollution, the cheapest, most obvious and most effective way to reduce light pollution is to start turning lights off or place motion sensors on essential outdoor lamps and use directional light to avoid the light bleeding onto adjacent properties.

Lift Station Red Light:

If you notice a red light on any of the lift station vaults located on Lower Pacific Drive, please notify the District as soon as possible. The red light signifies a malfunction of the pumping system and requires immediate attention to avoid a sewage spill.

Must have 1 year of experience in general construction work, or equivalent. Must live within 1 hour traveling time to Shelter Cove. Must possess a valid California driver's license. Passing a pre-employment physical and drug screen is required.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator Grade 1 or 2:

Minimum Qualifications: Must possess a valid Grade 1 or 2 Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator Certificate issued by California SWRCB. 2 years of experience working in a wastewater laboratory and wastewater treatment plant operation; Must pass a drug and alcohol screening and physical exam. Must possess a valid California driver's license and live within 1-hour traveling time to Shelter Cove.

Desired Qualifications: 1 year of experience in the operation of domestic water treatment and distribution. **Salary:** Compensation range \$19.55 to \$40.98 BOE.
