Responsibilities	<p>The North Louisiana Criminalistics Laboratory has an opening for a Firearms Section Supervisor. The scientist in this position is expected to be a case working examiner and proficiency tested. Duties include: Managing the day-to-day operations of the Firearms Section; technical and administrative review; training new examiners; ensuring quality control for the section; maintaining protocols; developing new and improved procedures; testifying; and other functions as required.</p> <p>The crime lab in Shreveport is a newly-built, 86,000 sq. ft., building (North Louisiana Forensic SciencesCenter), located in the northwest corner of Louisiana. The firearms section occupies the entire third floor of the main building, housing the firing range, office spaces, and laboratories. Each scientist has individual lab space, office space, computer, and basic lab equipment. The laboratory performs firearms and toolmarks examinations, serial number restoration, distance determination, and latent print examination.</p>		
Compensation	<p>The minimum starting salary is \$95,000 per year. The salary range is commensurate with education and experience. Documentation is required to verify experience. Employees' benefits include participation in a retirement system and 100% health, dental, and basic life insurance paid by the lab for the employee. Additionally, NLCL employees are also eligible to participate into a 457 Deferred Compensation Plan.</p>		
Qualifications	<p>Minimum educational qualifications include a B.S. degree in biology, chemistry, physics, or related physical, natural, or forensic science from an accredited college or university. A minimum of ten years firearms identification experience, including toolmarks examination and serial number restoration, is required. NIBIN and fingerprint examination experience is desirable.</p>

This position is open only to U.S. citizens and permanent residents. A valid driver's license is required. Applicants will be subjected to a background check of criminal history and a drug screen. An interview in Shreveport will be necessary before hiring.
