The Ministry will pay **ALL** your travel expenses as per the itinerary including all travel, meals and accommodations to any destination in world. **YOUR choice destination will also become YOUR pilgrimage.** You only need to bring spending money for your personal shopping. If lunch is not provided on the itinerary, the expense will be taken care of by us, or anyone

on the pilgrimage that would like to join you. I like to be flexible to allow what you choose to do.

With your destination in mind, we will plan the entire itinerary for you, arrange for tours, reserve chapels/churches for Mass (all Mass items and vestments are provided by the churches). You only have to bring a stole and alb in case we have no church available. **I WILL HAVE EVERYTHING ELSE YOU WILL NEED FOR THE MASS WITH ME.**

These are the only prerequisites that you must have: A valid passport and a document verifying you are a Priest.

The only thing asked of you is to direct the spirituality of the group, including Mass every day, lead the Rosary, listen to confessions, and any other devotions you choose to do. I would ask that you help us advertise the pilgrimage to help us obtain the minimum number of people so that this Ministry does not have to make up any difference. This is important because the finances are based on numbers, and as we are non-profit it is important to at least break even.

# REFLECTION ON THE SAMARITAN WOMAN AT THE WELL, THE WELL, A Pilgrim's Journey



**What would Jesus do?** Many of our brothers and sister ask themselves this question, perhaps you do as well, when discerning a decision or direction in life. It is a good question. Recently, during the Lenten season, I found myself thinking of this question after reading the scriptural passage regarding the Samaritan Woman at the Well (Jn 4:4-42).

**The times we live in seem so unpredictable.** We live in a period of alienation and anxiety. We worry and often times we feel alone. We protest modern society's accelerating change. What used to be valued may not be.

Perhaps, we have family members who have had multiple marriages, multiple partners, and multiple children from each of those relationships. We see friends, family or perhaps ourselves making "bad choices". Truths seem less valued; people make decisions based on feelings, what is relevant and what others do. St. Thomas Aquinas says we all look for happiness. We know people who are looking for happiness through multiple relationships; despite their failures. They keep hoping for something better. We try to find happiness in work, status or prestige. Sometimes, some of us no longer look for happiness; we become discouraged. We settle for numbing the pain. We turn to drugs or have conversations with Jim Beam and Jack Daniels.

**What would Jesus do? Good question.** The Samaritan woman at the well--- perhaps, she is discouraged; perhaps, she is in pain. She lives apart from the community. She seems to be a woman avoided. Women come to the well in the morning. It is cooler, they draw the water, they gossip and they listen to each other's joys and problems. We can imagine them commenting on how the children are doing and the neighborhood news. Perhaps, they laugh together; they accept each other. Not this woman. She comes at noon, in the heat of the day, when no one is there, or... not supposed to be there. **One person is there—Jesus.** He asks her for a drink of water. In asking for a drink of water, two big taboos or "socially inappropriate" issues stand out like the proverbial 800 pound gorilla in the room. First, Jesus is a Jew; the woman is a Samaritan. She even says to Jesus after his request, "How can you, a Jew ask me a Samaritan woman for a drink?" This is not what a Jew does. Jews, at that time, avoided, disliked, shunned and ostracized Samaritans. Jesus would become unclean if he touched or took the cup of water from her! Secondly, as is still the custom in some parts of the Middle East today, men do not



interact with women unless they are accompanied by a husband or male relative. It is scandalous.

What does Jesus do! Before we look at what Jesus does, let's look at what he does **not do**. He does not leave. He does not ignore or avoid. He does not yell or criticize. He doesn't say to her, "you are going to hell", "you are a slut" or you are making "bad choices in your life". Jesus does not say, "You can't find happiness through multiple relationships". He does not belittle, intimidate or blame her. How often do we criticize or blame? How often do we turn away? The reality is that when we blame, criticize, belittle or tell others they are wrong, people rarely change.

**What does Jesus do?** He invites and reaches out. He does not judge, He offers love and compassion. He does not leave or avoid but invites and reaches out. He listens. He does not judge her and tell her that she is "bad". He offers her love and compassion. Jesus offers her living water and she responds, "You don't have a bucket and the well is deep, where can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob? Jesus says to her, **"Everyone who drinks this water will thirst again but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst; the water that I shall give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."** As the conversation continues, Jesus tells her, "you have had five husbands and the one you are with now is not your husband." Jesus goes on to say the hour is coming and is now here when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and Truth". The woman responds, I know the Messiah is coming...he will tell us everything" and Jesus says, **"I who speak to you am he."**

The disciples return and are amazed Jesus is speaking with a woman. The woman leaves and becomes an evangelist to the community, "He told me everything I have done". The woman is reunited to the community. The village called Sychar comes to believe.

Jesus says to his astonished disciple when they ask him if he has eaten, **"My food is to do the will of the One who sent me and to finish his work"**. What will Jesus do? We now know what he does. **The real question is what do we---you and I do?**
