#### Red Cedar Basket with a Cross Stitch

Sunday, January 15, 2023 9:30 am to 3:30 pm Betty Hulse

Basket is made with red cedar spokes and dyed Hamburg cane for weavers, with waxed linen for weaving cross design. There is an opportunity to make variations in design and shape with the basket. Basket could vary in size, but in the range of 4" x 2 ½" to 3". Some of the baskets were woven with wire. It was difficult to see pattern with wire so we will use waxen linen for weaving pattern.





Class fee is \$30.

Material fee is \$12. Total of \$42.

Tools: Scissors, tapestry needle, spray bottle or sponge, towel to keep cedar moist.


Thursday, May 18, 2023 Cedar Purse Material Fee—\$40
