Learn to make t-shirt yarn, then weave an upcycled basket from a discarded waxy milk carton. Bring one or two t-shirts of different colors (preferably with no side seams or heavy plasticized logos) and a half gallon or smaller milk or juice carton. If you bring only one t-shirt, then maybe you can exchange some of your t-shirt yarn for a different color with a friend. We will be experimenting with twining patterns.

We are looking for volunteers to assist with some fourth grade classes with this same project on May 28th. Please contact April Barber if you are interested in helping.

These baskets can be used for a variety of purposes: plant holders, remote control holders, tool holders, center pieces for parties, small party favors, etc.

Thursday, May 16, 2024 Twined Basket Ann Taylor Class/Material Fee - \$60

Using one pattern from the sampler basket and a color of your choice, make a basket on a 5 1/2" cherry wood base. A decorative rim will finish off the basket. Tools: awl, sharp scissors, needle nose pliers, spray bottle, soaking tub.

Wednesday, May 15, 2024 Coiled Yarn Basket Gayle Still Class/Material Fee - \$50

Coiling with yarn around a core using just two stitches is a meditative way to create color, patterns and shape for a basket. The use of yarn is a great stash buster for spinners, knitters and crocheters, although raffia works well with this technique also. Embellishments will be discussed and feathers provided to end our basket. Tools: Scissors

### FLOWING TWILL PURSE OR SMALL TOTE

April 18, 2024 9:30 am—3:30 pm Sparks Masonic Center Instructor: Karen Olson (Class is limited to 12)

Try your hand at following a graphed pattern to make this striking twill weave purse or small tote. This sturdy little tote has a slotted wooden base for the start and a sixteen spoke repeat pattern. It's not a hard basket to make, but does require a bit of engineering and concentration. It'll be OK to mumble in front of 2 and behind 3...to keep tract of where you are, as you weave each start and stop row.



Tools: Scissors, packing tool (or a small flathead screw driver if you don't have a packing tool), spray bottle or sponge, small towel, 12" ruler.

Class fee: \$30.00 member, \$40.00 non-member

Material fee: \$35.00, includes a hand crafted adjustable leather shoulder strap.

# Irish Creel Willow Workshop with Eli Goodwin June 4 & 5, 2024

An Irish Creel is a woven load bearing basket or gathering basket (not a fishing creel.) It is made in the opposite direction to traditional stake and strand flat based baskets. The stakes are put in the ground or a jig and the top of the basket is woven first. The creel does not have a woven border; instead an incredibly tight weave called the mouth-wale is used for the first round. For our class Eli will have us place our stakes in a garden pot filled with dirt. The pot should be straight sided and measure between 12–15" across the top of the pot. Weavers will be expected to provide their own garden pot and dirt. The creel can be finished with either an open bottom or closed bottom.

The two day class will be held at Karen Olson's home at 4201 Fairview Rd, Reno, NV 89511. Sign-ups are open—registration is limited to 12. **The two day class is \$240** which includes the instructors fee and all the willow. **Half of the fee (\$120) is due upon sign-up**, with the balance due by May 17,2024 or you can pay the whole amount upon signing up.

You will need shears or clippers, knife, bodkin or large awl, metal or wooden rapping tool. For more information contact Sue Ann at samonte@charter.net or Karen at

- Regular meeting at Sparks Masonic Center. The meeting was called to order at 10:15 am by Betty Hulse. Today's meeting was in person and zoom with 17 attendees in person and 3 on zoom. It was wonderful to see new faces as well as returning members that we have not seen in some time. Prior minutes

  about weaving. This will be the same weaving on milk carton technique and she needs
  volunteers to assist. There will be 3 classes involved and the date is May 28.
- On March 21st Bonnie Kennedy will be teaching a Cherokee Wheel Basket. Cost \$30 member fee plus \$15 for materials.
- Nettie reported there are currently 25 signed up for the May retreat and there are a few spots available for classes. Bring your silent auction items for the retreat at the April 4 meeting. Remember any dollars received help fund the following year's retreat.
- An Irish Creel Willow workshop with Eli Goodwin will be held June 4 & 5 at Karen Olson's home. Cost \$240.
- Sad note: Ferne Olson, one of our past members, passed away recently. Our condolences to her family.
