Anyone present must comply with the Sweet Briar College COVID-19 Protocols. When outdoors participants are not required to mask if they can be socially distanced. Indoors masks are required regardless of vaccination status.

Entrance to the facility will only be through the main campus gate house. Anyone with a large truck and trailer will need to make arrangements with management to plan arrival.

Directions to the riding center from main entrance: At the first traffic circle take the second exit that takes you behind the chapel. At the second traffic circle take the first exit that will take you through a parking lot. Follow the road down the hill and around the Red Barn – the entrance to the riding center will be at the top of the hill. Please follow all signs for parking.

- ◇ Show management reserves the right to combine, cancel, and split classes as it deems necessary for the betterment of the competition.
- ◇ Sweet Briar College, its staff, officials, or SWVHJA will not be held responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, groom, or animal at the show.
- ◇ All exhibitors must wear ASTM-approved head gear with the chin strap fastened at all times when mounted on the show grounds.
- ◇ Tali's Grill will be on site and will have concessions available for purchase
- ◇ All schooling is at your own risk.
- ◇ All dogs must be on leashed while on the show grounds.

Entries

- ◇ Six ribbons will be awarded in each class
- ◇ Championship and Reserve Championship ribbons will be awarded in each hunter division. Ribbons can be picked up at the announcer's stand.
- ◇ Three entries, unless otherwise stated, are necessary to fill a class.
- ◇ Entry forms must be filled out completely, including all classes or divisions entered, signatures, and organization or membership numbers before numbers may be issued.
- ◇ A negative **Coggins** within 12 month and proof of vaccinations within 6 months of the show is required. A copy of the coggins test and SBC Health Requirement Form must be given to the secretary upon arrival.
- ◇ **An open check is required before numbers will be issued.**
- ◇ Pre-entry – must be entered by 3pm the Friday before the show.
- ◇ Entries received after 3PM the Friday before the show will be charge a \$10 office fee.
- ◇ No phone entries.

Hunter Divisions

All Hunter Classes are judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness.

Unjudged Warm Up - An unjudged warm up round to be ridden prior to your judged class. Only one round may be ridden in each section.

Open Hunter – Open to all riders mounted on horses or ponies. Unrecognized division. Fences offered at 2'3", 2'6" & 3'.

SWVHJA GREEN HUNTER - Open to horses in their first or second year of showing over fences at 2'6" or higher. To be eligible for green hunter status, horses may not have shown over fences 2'6" or higher prior to the current competition year. Fences to be 2'6" and 3'. Both heights must be offered and judged together.

A horse is eligible for reinstatement of their 1st Green year if they have not shown at more than three (3) shows over fences at 2'6" or higher prior to August 1st of the competition year upon application to the SWVHJA office. The application will be reviewed by the Board of Directors. Horses are eligible for one (1) reinstatement of Green status.

SWVJA Working Hunter – Open to horses. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences offered at 3'3" & 3'6". **The second course is designated as the Lt. Hatchell Handy Class - Awarded to the winner of the designated Working Hunter over Fences class which will have a special course with emphasis on brilliance and handiness that you would find in the hunting field. Hunting attire requested, but not required.**

SWVHJA Adult Hunter – Open to adult amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences to be 3'.

SWVHJA Childrens Hunter – Open to juniors mounted on horse. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences to be 3'.

SWVHJA Special Adult and Childrens Hunter – Open to horses or ponies shown by amateurs. Horse and rider combination cannot compete over fences higher than 2'9" at the same show. Fences 2'6" and 2'9".

SWVHJA Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse - Open to horses shown with hunter tack on the flat ridden by an Adult. Classes to be offered may include but are not limited to: Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. No over fences classes will count toward this division. (Shows offering a Pleasure Hunter division with over fences classes may offer this division as a separate division.) It is acceptable for SWVHJA Horse Shows to combine the Adult Hunter Pleasure and the Junior Pleasure Hunter Divisions, however, it is the show secretary's responsibility to indicate on the results which is the Adult rider and which is the Junior rider. If entries warrant, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Division and the Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse division. To be judged on manners, suitability, and way of going. For year end points to accrue, three entries must enter and compete in all three classes of the division.

SWVHJA Hunter Pleasure Pony - Open to ponies shown with hunter tack on the flat ridden by a Junior. Classes to be offered may include but are not limited to: Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. No over fences classes will count toward this division. (Shows offering a Pleasure Hunter division with over fences classes may offer this division as a separate division.) If entries warrant, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Horse division and Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse division. A pony can be considered a horse at a show if the pony is not exhibited in a pony restricted division such as pony. Therefore, it is acceptable for an adult to ride a pony in the Adult Pleasure Division as long as the pony is not shown in pony restricted division at the same show.

Equitation Division

2'-2'3" Junior & Amateur Equitation Division – Open to riders and horses/ponies that have not competed over fences 2'11" or higher in any competition.

Equitation Classes

SWVHJA Adult Equitation on the Flat - Open to amateurs 18 years of age and older. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the flat. Riders must stay within their age group if classes are split by age.

SWVHJA Junior Equitation on the Flat – Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Judged on position, control, and guidance, USEF tests 1-19 may be used. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Adult Equitation on the Flat. Will be split by age (15-17 & 14 and Under). Riders must stay within their age group.

SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal Class - Open to riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown over a course of fences not to exceed 3' that must include two changes of direction, a combination and at least three oxers. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Martingales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase to count 50%. Same horse must be used for both phases. Four entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to complete the class. If there are fewer than four entries, this class can be combined with the Adult Medal. SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Hunter Seat Medal Finals.

SWVHJA Adult Medal Class - Same specs as for the SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal Class, except open to amateur riders 18 years of age and older. Ponies may be ridden by adults, but may not be shown in the Pony Hunter division at the same horse show. If there are fewer than four entries, this class can be combined with the Hunter Seat Medal. SWVHJA Adult Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Adult Medal Finals.

Sweet Briar College Medal – Open to juniors and amateurs. To be shown over a course of no less than six jumps set at 2'9". Course must include two changes of direction, and may contain an in and out. The judge will then have the option of testing the top four riders. Tests 1-10 may be used. The same horse must be used in both phases. Three competitors must compete the course for points to count. Riders may not have shown in a 3'6" or higher equitation medal class, and may not jump higher than 2'9" at the same show. This class may be combined with other classes with similar specifications. This class is not recognized or sanctioned by SWVHJA. Finals will be held at the SWVHJA Annual Horse Show. To qualify for the 2021 finals, a rider must have competed in at least one SBC Medal class prior to the finals.

Oakridge Medal – Open to junior and adult amateurs. Over fences phase will consist of a USET-type equitation and AO/JR jumper course of at least 10 fences at 3' – 3'3" with spreads up to 4'. Flat phase counts for 50% and must be run first. No martingales of any kind are permitted in the flat phase. Ten riders from the flat phase will be called back for the over fences phase; jump order to be chosen by the judge. Judge may require additional rests from USEF tests 1-19. Minimum of 3 to fill class.

Directions:

From Charlottesville: On Route 29S, take the Madison Heights/Sweet Briar College exit. Go two miles past the college entrance. Turn right just before the Bet Bet/Citgo service station onto Route 663/Smokey Hollow Road. Go about one mile, bearing right at the fork. At the bottom of a fairly steep hill you will see a sign for the Harriet Rogers Riding Center. Turn right.

From Lynchburg: On Route 29N go about 10 miles past the James River to Faulconerville. After the Excel Station (on right), get in the left lane. Turn left at the Best Bet/Citgo station, driving across Route 29S onto Route 663/Smokey Hollow Road. Go about one mile, bearing right at the fork. At the bottom of a fairly steep hill you will see a sign for the Harriet Rogers Riding Center. Turn right.

From South of Lynchburg: On Route 29N just past the Lynchburg airport, exit onto 460 East towards Appomattox. Take exit 29N Bypass (Charlottesville/Amherst). Exit at Route 29 Business/Amherst/Sweet Briar College. At the end of the exit turn left to go towards Sweet Briar College/Madison Heights. Go two miles past the college entrance. Turn right just before the Bet Bet/Citgo service station onto Route 663/Smokey Hollow Road. Go about one mile, bearing right at the fork. At the bottom of a fairly steep hill you will see a sign for the Harriet Rogers Riding Center. Turn right.

Parking:

- ◇ Please watch for and follow parking signs
- ◇ Large trailers/horse vans may turn around in the parking area behind the indoor arena.
- ◇ Large trailers and horse vans may park on the East Side of the riding Center or in the parking lot behind the indoor arena.
- ◇ To keep the road clear, parking is restricted to the south side of the road, which is the right side of the road as you enter the facility.

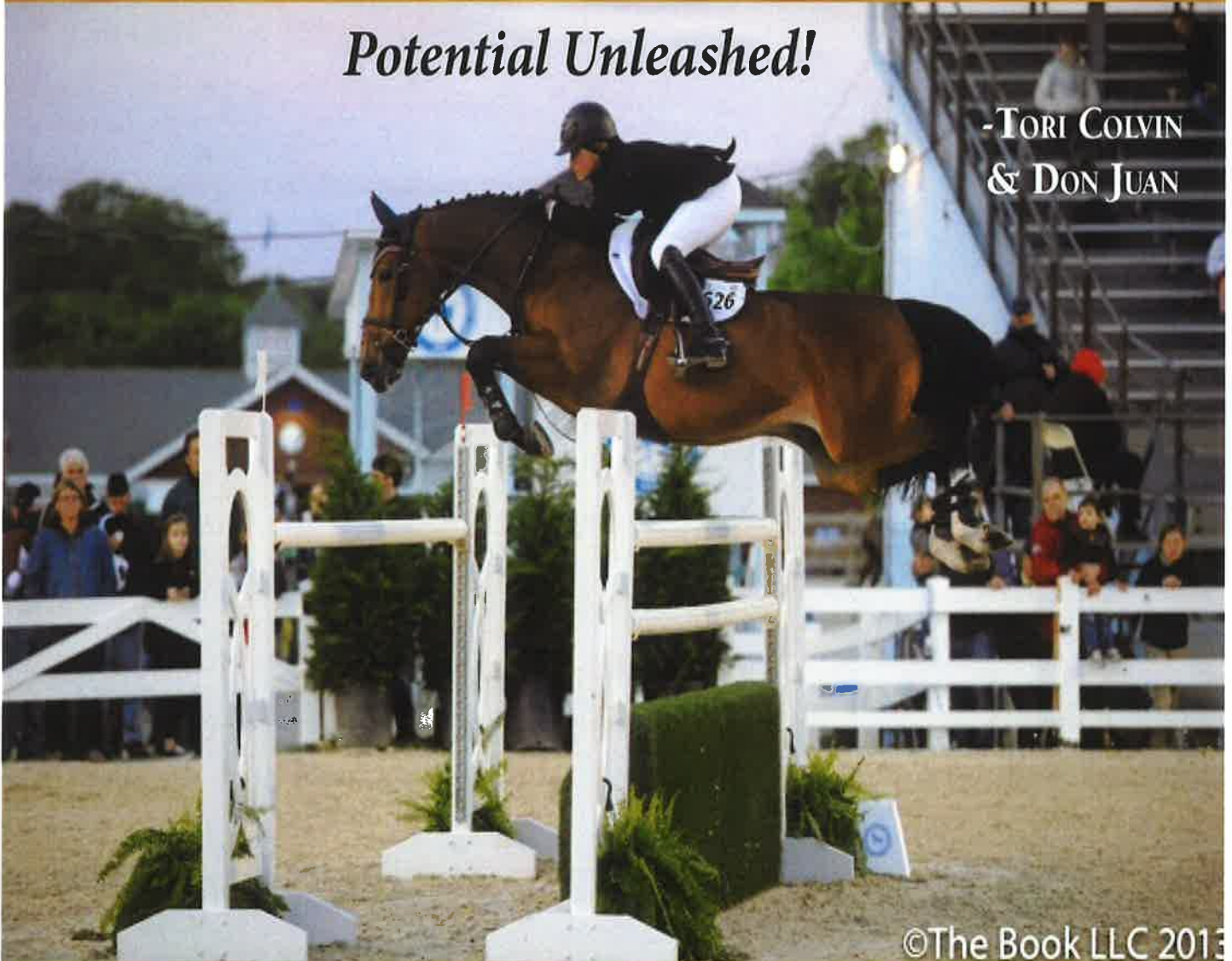

Release and Waiver of Liability

I am aware that during my participation and attendance at the Sweet Briar College Horse Show and related events and activities, Sweet Briar College and its agents, employees and associates ("Sponsor"), will be providing various facilities and arrangements for the show, and that certain risks and dangers may arise, including but not limited to hazards inherent in the sports in which I will be training, preparing or competing, negligent or other careless acts and omissions by other participants, spectators and the sponsor, and hazardous or dangerous conditions of the facilities and grounds used.

In consideration of the acceptance of my entry by the Sponsor and the right granted to me to participate in and attend the Show and related activities, I do hereby assume all of the above risks, and agree that, in the event of any injury to me as a result of an accident which occurs during my involvement and participation in the show, my recovery against the Sponsor, shall be limited to a claim for medical expenses incurred as a result of the injury, and only to the extent that such medical expenses are not otherwise covered or paid by my insurance coverage, medical or otherwise, furthermore, for the consideration, I agree to protect my claim for personal injury for six (6) months from the date of injury; if I fail to do so, I agree that I will have waived any and all rights I have to recover against the Sponsor for said injury.

Additionally, in consideration and acceptance of my entry by the Sponsor and the right to participate in and attend the Show and related activities, I consent to receive any and all emergency medical attention and transportation that may be deemed appropriate under the circumstances as then determined by the Sponsor or its agents. I also grant Sweet Briar College permission to use my likeness, name, and words in television, radio, film, or in any form to promote activities at Sweet Briar College. I also understand that there will be no refund.

Following portion pertains only to parents or guardian of a participant who is 17 years of age or younger.

I have read and consent to the above limitations on recovery and agree on my and my child's behalf that any recovery against the Sponsor for injury arising as a result of an accident which occurs during my child's involvement and participation in the show, should said injury occur due to the negligence of the Sponsor, shall be limited to a claim for medical expenses incurred as a result of said injury, and only to the extent that such medical expenses are not otherwise covered or paid by my or my child's insurance coverage, medical or otherwise. Furthermore, for the consideration, I agree to protect my claim to personal injury to my child and the sponsor within six (6) months from the date of injury; if I fail to do so, I agree that I will have waived any and all rights I have to recover against the Sponsor for said injury.

**EQUINE ACTIVITY RELEASE / WAIVER,
ASSUMPTION OF RISKS AND INDEMNIFICATION
AGREEMENT (the "Agreement")**

I, as participant or parent or guardian of participant, acknowledge that equine activities are athletic activities that pose potentially serious risk of injuries or death to participants in equine activities. I acknowledge that there are certain intrinsic dangers or conditions that are an integral part of equine activities, including but not limited to, (i) the propensity of equines to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death to persons on or around them; (ii) the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals; (iii) certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions; (iv) collisions with other animals or objects; and (v) the potential of a participant acting in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or not acting within the participant's ability (collectively, "Intrinsic Dangers of Equine Activities"). I understand that participants in equine activities may be injured or killed as a result of their own negligence, the negligence of others or through no fault of participant or anyone else.

In consideration of Sweet Briar College (the "College") allowing participant to participate in equine activities at the College, on behalf of myself and my heirs, successors, and assigns I hereby release and waive any rights to make any claim against the College, its employees, agents and representatives for any loss, damage, injury, or death to person or property sustained by participant in equine activities by any cause whatsoever, including but not limited to, (i) the Intrinsic Dangers of Equine Activities; (ii) the experience level of any participant; (iii) a known or unknown health condition of any participant; and/or (iv) the condition and age of equipment or tack. I hereby acknowledge and assume all of the foregoing risks and any other risks inherent in equine activities and accept complete responsibility for making any and all examinations or inspections relating to those risks and any other potential risks of recreational activities, and I agree and understand that the College shall have no responsibility whatsoever to make any such examination or inspection. I further assume all risk of participating in equine activities, and agree to indemnify and hold harmless the College, its employees, representatives and agents from and against, all of the foregoing claims and any and all loss, damage, injury, or death to person or property by whatever cause including any act or omission negligent or otherwise, on the part of the College, its employees, representatives or agents, or on the part of any other person arising from or related to participation in equine activities.

With this waiver, I accept notice of the provisions of the Virginia Equine Activity Liability Act, Va. Code §§ 3.2-6200 through 6203. This waiver shall remain valid unless and until revoked in writing by the participant or the parent or guardian of any minor signing below, with receipt acknowledged by the College.

I hereby certify that the statements and representations in this Agreement are being made by me knowingly, freely, and voluntarily, and I understand that the College is expressly relying upon the foregoing statements and representations in permitting my/my child's participation in any equine activities.
