

COACH SPOTLIGHT



WHEN AND WHERE DID YOU START PADDLING?

My first paddling experience was as a child we had an old fibre glass kayak called Snoopy, which my dad acquired. He took me and my brother on the local canal to sink or swim. Back in the early 80's I was a Youth Worker at Staffs County Council and we managed to raise funds for a fleet of 8 kayaks and paddling gear to deliver paddling to the young people. This is what started me on the Leadership/ Coaching journey.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN PART OF BURTON CANOE CLUB?

I Joined probably late 80,s early 90's to further my paddling skills as this was the best local club to my location of West Midlands - There was a bit of a paddling guru there apparently at that time that did quite a lot for local paddlers (I'm still there now looking for him ha! ha!)

FAVOURITE PADDLING LOCATION AFTER THE TRENT AND WHY?

This is a hard one to pin down to one location, there are lots of favourites for different reasons. I have fond memories of white water kayaking in Scotland and Wales, which was my first skill set. Before mastering the art of open canoeing on lakes and rivers. The challenge was to take the open canoe on the white water I had taken my kayak previously. A different style of paddling. I think my favourite these days is multi day expeditions in canoe with either campsites or better still, wild camping. This has taken me to various French, Scottish and English rivers. I am still very active with the Duke of Edinburgh Award which feeds this passion regularly

PADDLING HIGHLIGHT?
A few of us did a multi-day paddling trip in Scotland. We started on Loch Shiel, then came out the bottom continuing along the river Shiel, then out to sea to follow the coast round to the finish point. For those of you that have been to Scotland, as beautiful as it is the weather is extremely unpredictable. On this occasion we could have been in the Mediterranean. The weather was to die for, the water clean and clear and we vowed never to do this trip again as we could never, ever beat it.
