

The First World Day For Grandparents and The Elderly

July 25, 2021

On January 31, 2021, Pope Francis announced an international day to honor grandparents and the elderly to take place each year on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the feast of the grandparents of Jesus, Saint Joachim and Saint Anne.

**Saint Joachim and Saint Anne**

Names for the parents of Mary, grandparents of Jesus, found in the 2nd century *Protoevangelium of James*.

Saint Martha sister of Mary and Lazarus; model of hospitality and faithful disciple; confessed her faith in Jesus as the Son of God. *"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing"* Luke 10:41-42

Saint Peter Chrysologus "of golden worded" for his exceptional preaching ability. He died around the year 450. He was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1729.

Saint Ignatius of Loyola was a soldier and in 1520, his leg was shattered in a military battle, and during his recovery he read the stories of the saints and the life of Christ. He noticed that the saints' stories produced a peace in his soul. Later, this "discernment of spirits" would become an important feature of Ignatius' Spiritual Exercises. He developed a devoted group of followers, and in 1540, Pope Paul III, approved the "Society of Jesus", known as the Jesuits (Pope Francis was the first Pope from the Jesuit Order). St Ignatius died in 1556.

Brothers and Sisters,

Before we explore today's readings, I would like to share with you something you may not have heard about. On Sunday, January 31, 2021, Pope Francis announced the establishment of an *international* day to honor grandparents and the elderly to take place each year in July and today is that day. In making the announcement, he said speaking of the wisdom of the elderly that, "their voice is precious because it sings the praises of God and guards the roots of peoples. They remind us that old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between generations, to transmit to young people an experience of life and faith."



In establishing this special day Pope Francis went on to say "Grandparents are often forgotten and we forget their wealth of preserving and passing on the roots. For this reason, I have decided to establish the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly." This celebration will take place annually on the 4th Sunday in July, close to the feast of the grandparents of Jesus, Saints Joachim and Anne, which this year is tomorrow, July 26th. Here in the United States, we also celebrate *national* grandparents day each year, which will be September 12 this year.

Turning now to today's readings we hear two different stories of small amounts of food feeding hundreds and thousands of people. In our first reading Elisha tells his servant to give to the people the 20 barley loaves that had been presented to him. We are talking about feeding about 100 people with 20 loaves which does not seem too hard to do but the barley loaves given to Elisha were at that time probably about the size of a dinner roll. The generosity of one man to Elisha was followed by the generosity of Elisha to satisfy the hunger of many more. In our second reading from Paul's letter to the Ephesians, St. Paul tells us the Spirit of God brings unity and peace and calls us to be generous and gentle with one another.

Finally, in today's gospel we hear the story of Jesus feeding the five thousand hungry people who came to listen to him. The reality is that it was probably more like ten thousand if we take into account the women and children. I'm sure for many of us this is one of our favorite gospel miracles. If we stop to think for a moment, we come to realize that in this miracle Jesus was not just in the business of feeding others-he was also teaching others how to feed hungry people.

This life-affirming story is a reminder of God's inclusive generosity. Jesus shows compassion for the crowds, caring for their material as well as spiritual needs. God asks us to feed people in need too. This beautiful miracle reminds us that we can offer to God all that we are. Even if we think it's inadequate, we can trust God to take it, bless it, break it open and multiply it. Jesus showed the crowd and shows us that when God is with us, there is no such thing as scarcity. And when God asks us to be a blessing to others, we must have trust and faith in him to respond. Even a very simple act, like a smile, can have a huge impact on many lives.

Pope Francis Apostolic Letter

"*Patris Corde*" ("With A Father's Heart")

On the 150th Anniversary of the Proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church and Year of Saint Joseph.

7. St. Joseph—A father in the shadows Part 1

The Polish writer Jan Dobraczyński, in his book *The Shadow of the Father*,[24] tells the story of Saint Joseph's life in the form of a novel. He uses the evocative image of a shadow to define Joseph. In his relationship to Jesus, Joseph was the earthly shadow of the heavenly Father: he watched over him and protected him, never leaving him to go his own way. We can think of Moses' words to Israel: "In the wilderness... you saw how the Lord your God carried you, just as one carries a child, all the way that you travelled" (Deut 1:31). In a similar way, Joseph acted as a father for his whole life.[25]

Fathers are not born, but made. A man does not become a father simply by bringing a child into the world, but by taking up the responsibility to care for that child. Whenever a man accepts responsibility for the life of another, in some way he becomes a father to that person.

Children today often seem orphans, lacking fathers. The Church too needs fathers. Saint Paul's words to the Corinthians remain timely: "Though you have countless guides in Christ, you do not have many fathers" (1 Cor 4:15). Every priest or bishop should be able to add, with the Apostle: "I became your father in Christ Jesus through the Gospel" (*ibid.*). Paul likewise calls the Galatians: "My little children, with whom I am again in travail until Christ be formed in you!" (4:19).



FEAST OF FAITH

The Preface Dialogue

"Lift up your hearts." "We lift them up to the Lord." "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God." "It is right to give him thanks and praise." With this ancient dialogue we enter the Eucharistic Prayer, the heart of the Mass. These venerable words have been part of the Christian liturgy almost from the beginning—by the time of Hippolytus of Rome (c. 215) they were already fixed in the liturgy.

Several times during the Mass the priest has invited us to pray. There is something different here. We are invited to be "lifted up," to ascend, to climb the Lord's mountain, as it were, to go to a new place for this most solemn part of the Mass. And we are invited to a new frame of mind, a sense of joy, of focused dedication: our hearts must not be cast down, but lifted up, and lifted to the Lord. Why? Because we are going to give thanks—we are going to "eucharist!" It is right and just that we do this.

y dos pescados.
Pero, ¿qué es eso para tanta gente?”

JUAN 6:8-9

DIOS NOS ALIMENTA Y CUIDA

El mensaje de hoy podría resumirse en el salmo 145 “La mano del Señor nos alimenta, el Señor está cerca de los que lo invocan”. Cada lectura muestra con qué cuidado Dios nos alimenta y cuida, de una manera cercana y personal. Eliseo alimentó a la multitud con veinte panes de cebada. Jesús bendijo unos pocos panes y alimentó a miles. Tal vez esto parezca inverosímil, pero en las noticias leemos historias de cocineros que toman lo que sobró en restaurantes de lujo y alimentan a muchas personas en un comedor comunitario. De niña, uno de mis cuentos favoritos fue Sopa de piedras, que era la historia de un par de soldados cansados por la guerra que convencen a los habitantes asustados y hambrientos de un pueblito para que saquen sus escasos alimentos y los comparten para hacer una maravillosa sopa que alimente al pueblo. La segunda lectura nos pide que “consideremos bien nuestra llamada”. ¿Cómo respondemos a las personas necesitadas que nos rodean?

¿MILAGRO O MAGIA?

Puede ser fácil decir simplemente “Oh sí, esta es la historia del milagro de la multiplicación de los panes y los peces, cuando todos decidieron compartir los pedazos de comida que tenían”. Pero ¿qué tanto se trata de alimentar a las multitudes? Jesús le preguntó a Felipe en dónde podrían comprar suficiente comida para que todos comieran. Le hizo esta pregunta para ponerlo a prueba, porque sabía que era lo que iba a hacer. Debió haber sido muy difícil confiar en Jesús, especialmente cuando los discípulos a menudo no lo entendían. Este año también ha sido un reto para nosotros también, confiar que Dios proveerá, y también un reto para nosotros para pedir ayuda.

En la Regla de san Benito hay un capítulo llamado “La asignación de tareas imposibles”. En esencia dice que cuando el superior de la comunidad te dice que hagas algo imposible, está bien que vayas a hablar con él acerca de eso, pero al final puede que te pidan que hagas esa tarea. ¿En qué situaciones estamos llamados a confiar? ¿Cuándo se nos piden que actuemos con fe o que hagamos una tarea imposible?

¿CÓMO SABREMOS QUE ESTAMOS HACIENDO LO CORRECTO?

Los milagros rara vez son tan evidentes como la multiplicación de los panes y los peces. Hace muchos años, cuando terminaba un fin de semana festivo, por casualidad escuché una conversación familiar en un restaurante. En la caja registradora había una de esas alcancías con un letrero que decía: “Con cincuenta centavos al día puedes alimentar a un niño”. Una pequeña niña les preguntó a sus padres y ellos le explicaron. Ella dijo: “Me quedó algo de mi dinero que tuve para gastar este fin de semana, ¿puedo ponerlo en la alcancía?” Los padres dijeron que sí y ella misma puso el dinero dentro de la alcancía y luego fue a sentarse a la mesa con ellos y siguieron charlando. Ella les dijo: “Si cincuenta centavos sirven para alimentar a un niño al día, entonces pude alimentar a uno por tres días, por que me quedaban \$1.50 de mi dinero”. Al seguir el ejemplo de esta niña y vamos más allá de lo mínimo, cuando damos todo lo que podemos, sabemos que estamos haciendo lo correcto, y hemos comprendido la prueba que Jesús le hizo a Felipe hace mucho tiempo.

FIESTA DE LA FE

De la epiclesis a la narración

La narración es una parte de la Plegaria Eucarística y comienza después de la epiclesis, es decir, quien preside la Eucaristía (y quien concelebra, si es el caso), invocan el poder del Espíritu Santo para que consagre los dones que la Iglesia ha ofrecido; que se conviertan en el cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo. El signo visible que acompaña este momento es la imposición de manos sobre los dones. A partir de esta invocación, comienza la narración de la Institución en que Nuestro Señor Jesucristo nos deja la Eucaristía en el contexto de una comida. Esta narración es esencial a la fe cristiana porque describe el dinamismo de su Tradición de una forma pura y fiel. Pablo nos lo recuerda en la primera carta a los corintios: “Yo he recibido del Señor lo que a mi vez les he transmitido” (23). Así pues, el recuerdo de la institución eucarística en el contexto de una comida, no sólo era una historia bonita para recordar, sino un precepto del mismo Jesús que identificará a la comunidad con una historia nueva, una nueva Pascua, un nuevo pan, una Nueva Alianza que se renueva cada vez que se come de este pan y se bebe de este cáliz. Todo esto sucede ahí mismo, frente a nuestros ojos.

Primer Día Mundial de los Abuelos y los Ancianos - 25 de julio de 2021

El 31 de enero de 2021, el Papa Francisco anunció una jornada internacional para honrar a los abuelos y a los ancianos que tendrá lugar cada año el cuarto domingo de julio, cerca de la fiesta de los abuelos de Jesús, San Joaquín y Santa Ana.



San Joaquín y Santa Ana

Nombres de los padres de María, abuelos de Jesús, encontrados en el *Protoevangelio de Santiago del siglo II*.

Santa Marta, hermana de María y Lázaro; modelo de hospitalidad y discípula fiel; confesó su fe en Jesús como Hijo de Dios. "Marta, Marta, estás inquieta y preocupada por muchas cosas. Sólo hace falta una cosa" Lucas 10:41-42

San Pedro Crisólogo "hombre de palabras de oro" por su excepcional capacidad de predicación. Murió hacia el año 450. Fue declarado Doctor de la Iglesia en 1729.

San Ignacio de Loyola era un soldado y en 1520, su pierna fue destrozada en una batalla militar, y durante su recuperación leyó las historias de los santos y la vida de Cristo. Notó que las historias de los santos producían una paz en su alma. Más tarde, este "discreción de espíritus" se convertiría en una característica importante de los Ejercicios Espirituales de Ignacio. Desarrolló un devoto grupo de seguidores, y en 1540, el Papa Pablo III, aprobó la "Compañía de Jesús", conocida como los Jesuitas (el Papa Francisco fue el primer Papa de la Orden Jesuita). San Ignacio murió en 1556.


