About the Matthew 25 Image:

The circular shape represents unity and equality. Like God, a circle has no beginning and no end, and it symbolizes our continuing effort to help one another. The shape also suggests a globe that points to our engagement with the world. The three interlocking figures represent the equality of all people without gender or race bias. They have their arms around each other, symbolizing friendship, protection and service. The number three suggests the three focus areas we will be looking at as well as the Trinity. The color palette is bright, lively, friendly, and energetic, suggestive of our active commitment. We use a handwritten font to make the point that active engagement in the world requires human effort.
