## **Remembering Otha Five Years Later (05/10/43-08/06/09)**

Hard to believe that it has been five years since Otha left this earth due to cancer. Otha's name is synonymous with the name Juice Newton.

He always had a positive outlook on situations and people. He was never one to judge or think negatively. He always saw the best in people. His willingness to see the best all around him was conveyed in his music. The song writing skills that he had were used to communicate deep thoughts, be them of love or just plain fun. He conveyed these thoughts

and emotions very well in his music.

Otha and Juice were almost psychic on stage. They knew what helped or hindered a performance or song and without uttering a word enacted on the thought. The execution was not detectable unless you knew them personally.

Juice and Otha were the very best of friends. The companionship went beyond the stage. They had fun and did all the things close friends do with family and mutual friends and those memories are cherished by all.

Otha married Brenda and they had a daughter Makena. Brenda and Makena sacrificed time with Otha because of his career which consisted of many tour dates. The characteristic of selflessness is one to describe the entire Young family.

40 years plus of practicing and touring is a gift. This gift is seldom heard of any longer. Otha's presence on stage was always felt. His ability to be noticed by being subtle was one of his attributes.

When someone has such a positive impact on others including those they did not know is perhaps the greatest compliment. If you listen closely to the lyrics in such songs as "The Sweetest Thing (I've Ever Known)" and "For Believers" you can hear the thought and heart that was put into them. Some of the other songs you can feel enjoyment and fun are "Eye of A Hurricane" and "Don't Bother Me."

Otha passed away in 2009 and although his presence is missed on stage and at home, his legacy of good will and wonderful music will live on forever in all of us. He was my friend and I will always remember him. Paul

## Juice Touring with Exile

Many fans remember the country band Exile. Their music was played consistently on the airwaves in the 1980's. Juice has been touring with Exile and if they come to your area you won't be disappointed.

The tour is called the back2back Tour.

Everyone's talking about Exile and Juice Newton being the **PERFECT FIT**. All 5 original members of Exile on stage with Juice Newton performing their country and pop hits.

### Show Overview:

- Exile performs their **seven #1 country hits**
- Juice performs **six of her top-ten hits** with full Exile band backing her
- Exile performs a capella version of "People Get Ready"
- Exile plays a medley of hits they wrote for other artists, including:
  - **Alabama's "The Closer You Get" and "Take Me Down"**
  - **Restless Heart's "When She Cries"**
  - **Diamond Rio's "A Beautiful Mess"**
  - **Janie Fricke's "It Ain't Easy Bein' Easy"**
- Ends with **Exile's "I Want to Kiss You All Over"**
- *Encore:* Juice and Exile take stage together to play a medley of Motown hits, including "Sign Sealed Delivered" and "Keep Me Hanging On,"

- In 1963, the year before the Beatles scored their first American hit, a group of kids calling themselves The Exiles climbed onto an outdoor stage in the small midstate town of Richmond, Kentucky and proceeded to make musical history – not just with their songs but with their longevity as well. Over 50 years later, that same band Exile is still rockin' with a mix of original and seminal members. Nations have had shorter life spans. Nowadays, J. P. Pennington, Les Taylor, Sonny LeMaire, Marlon Hargis and Steve Goetzman can look back on a career arc that embraces 11 No. 1 country and pop hits, two gold albums and fans by the hundreds of thousands.
- **JUICE NEWTON**
- In 1981 Newton's career exploded into the mainstream with her album *Juice*, thanks to the enormous hits "Angel of the Morning," "Queen of Hearts," and #1 country smash hit, "The Sweetest Thing (I've Ever Known)." Delivering tearful, wall-

of-sound pop, sprightly country-rock and everything in between with crystalline tone and infectious energy, Newton brought a sparkling authenticity to an era dominated by artifice. *Juice* went platinum and became an international monster, "The Sweetest Thing" spent 18 weeks in the Top 40, and Newton earned two Grammy nominations for Best Female Vocalist. Since then she has become a Grammy, CMA and Billboard award-winning artist who has multiple platinum and gold albums, ten million records sold and 15 Top 10 hits under her belt.

## Flashback



The year is 1987 and the single "First Time Caller" was released a few weeks prior to the album "EMOTIONS." release date. Let's relive some of the magic of this album.

Juice had tremendous success with her album "Old Flame." There were many hits off that album and this left her fans wanting more. Juice took to the studio and recorded the album "Emotions" on RCA Records.

When I heard that the single "First Time Caller" was being released I called the local station and requested it and they played it often. Then Juice was seen on Ralph Emery's "Nashville Now" debuting this song. This was Juice's first 9 song album. Instead of the normal ten song album.

Then along came the release of the second single "Tell Me True" and this was a fun up-tempo song that shot into the top ten. Juice's ability to bring fun and serious feelings into the songs on this album is why the title of the album "Emotions" was perfect!

This album contained a song written by Otha Young that is beautiful entitled "I Still Love You." This is one of those story songs that you can purely visualize as it is sung. Jaw Cawley, bass guitar and vocals in Juice's band, wrote a song entitled "Someone Believed" and this song is about never losing sight of your dreams and going for them.
