We are looking for any coiled, twined or plaited baskets made with willow, tule, pine needles, or bark.

We welcome any volunteers who would like to help with setting-up the exhibit.



As we move toward the end of 2025—it's time to think about 2026. What classes and activities do we want to plan for next year.

We had some weather issues with this year's St Mary's workshop, so we have made some changes in the scheduling for next year. Two things: we moved the date up to September 28-October 1 and we have scheduled three nights with two full days for weaving. We will be checking in on Monday afternoon after 3 pm and exiting Thursday morning by 11 am. This way we will be able to start the class by 8 am both days for two full days of weaving. We will be able to get the check in and settling done on Monday afternoon with some social time to get acquainted. Thursday morning will be devoted to last bits of finishing and clean-up. St Mary's charge for the facility will be the same amount. We have not yet chosen an instructor for the workshop, so we are open to suggestions for the class.

We also need to begin the planning process for next year's classes and Programs. We had trouble filling classes during the summer months, so maybe we should consider a different venue for classes (outdoors) or not schedule during the summer. Do we need more beginner classes, more natural materials classes, etc. Put on your thinking cap for what you would like to see or what you would like to teach. We do need more teachers, as many of our past teachers have retired or are no longer with us.

Prior to the November meeting, we will be doing an inventory of materials that have been donated to our group. It would be good to plan some projects for next year, where we could use up some of these materials.

Small Willow Rib Basket November 20, 2025 9:30 am — 3:00 pm Sparks Masonic Center Instructor: Sue Ann Monteleone

Rib baskets (also known as frame baskets, Appalachian egg baskets, etc.) are plaited baskets generally constructed on two crossed rings with spokes inserted to form 'ribs'. Rings and ribs will be provided as well as willow weavers. We will connect the rings with God's Eyes and the ribs will be inserted into that structure. You can bring your own additional weaving material: iris cordage, chunky yarn, red hot poker leaves, fresh red twig dogwood, honeysuckle, wisteria, etc. Some tule will also be provided. You can weave completely with willow, or allow your creative side to add a unique touch.

Class limit - 12

Fee – Members \$35/non-members \$40

Materials - \$20

Tools needed – small clippers, medium awl, a few clips, spray bottle or sponge, towel
