-My favorite part of the OVDBA Show is showing cows. This is because you get to show off your cow, and you learn more about showing and handling your cow properly.

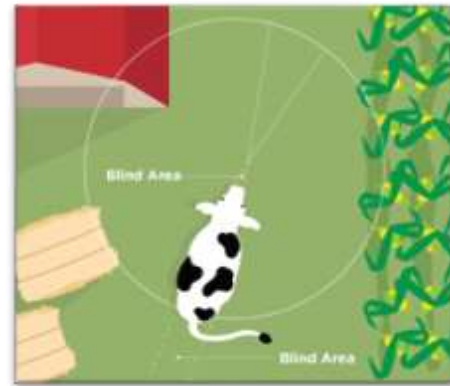

Did you know that cows have a 330-degree field of vision?

A cow has mostly monocular vision. Monocular vision allows a cow, for example, to keep one eye on the horizon and the other eye alert for approaching predators. With the unique positioning of its eyes, a cow has a panoramic view that spans 330 degrees around its head. A cow can spot a threat from almost any direction. But even with this remarkable field of view, cows do not have depth perception -as they have no vision behind them. Given the positioning of their eyes, cows also have a blind area in front of their nose.



With this in mind, remember to make your presence known to your cow. Let them hear your voice while you're moving them. You can also pat them on the backside.

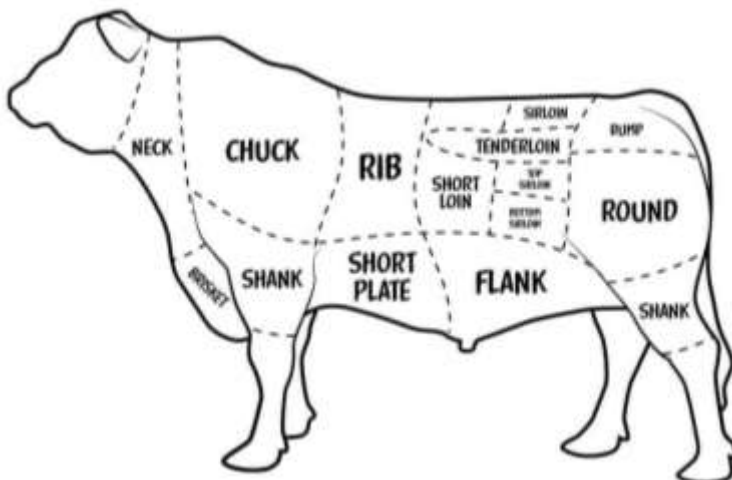
