

IMO MODEL COURSE 1.19 PERSONAL SURVIVAL TECHNIQUES

A.-TECHNICAL FOUNDATION

In accordance with the International Convention on training, certification and guarding for

Seafarers, STCW 95, all persons employed or contracted on board a seagoing vessel, other than passengers, will receive approved training that allows them to become familiar with personal survival techniques and know act in case a person falls into the sea.

This curricular planning has been made based on the OMI Model course, No. 1.19 and Rule VI/1, Section A-VI/1 of STCW95.

The proposed evaluation criteria are detailed in Table A-VI/1-1 of the STCW 95.

B.-GENERAL OBJECTIVES

1. At the end of the course, the student is expected to be able to:
2. React correctly during emergency situations, such as rescue of a person fallen into the sea, evacuation or abandonment.
3. Take appropriate measures for her own survival and that of others and Use survival equipment correctly.
4. Describe and correct deficiencies to prevent emergency situations.

Officers and Crew Members of the Merchant and Fishing Navy.

NUMBER OF STUDENTS: The amount will be proportional to the infrastructure, implementation and qualified human resources to teach the course.
