Part Forty-Two: "Excellence in Brotherly Love, Part 1"

I Thessalonians 4:9 - But as touching brotherly love ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are taught of God to love one another.

Your actions demonstrate if you have <u>learned</u> how to love

- 1. Loving <u>fellow believers</u> (philadelphos) comes as a natural result of being <u>loved</u> by God (agape). But as touching brotherly love, love one another
- 2. My <u>actions</u> demonstrate my love or my lack of love.

 ye need not that I write unto you
- 3. God teaches everyone who is <u>willing</u> to learn how to love other believers. for ye yourselves are taught of God to love one another

How do you show that you are willing for God to teach you to love?

- I) By being willing to <u>listen</u>. 2:13.
- 2) By responding properly to being attacked. 2:14.
- 3) By choosing to love those who are hating you. 1:6-8.
