A dear friend posted this reflection regarding Lent this week: "Every pastor the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday: "Lent, is that you grumbling right behind us???" I know Lent is coming every year and yet it seems to creep up on me all the same. It is a season set apart, a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a season of self-examination and reflection. The word Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word. lencten, meaning lengthen, referring to the lengthening days of spring. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, we Christians focus on our relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others. We begin this forty day journey on Ash Wednesday, hearing the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust vou shall return." Ideally, as we make this forty day journey in the wilderness, we follow in the steps of Jesus, resisting temptation and preparing for ministry. I wonder what challenges we might face in these forty days that test and try us, but too, how we challenge ourselves and our church as we seek to live out God's liberating love in this wilderness. Here's how my friend Maggie ended her Lenten charge: Here's your Lenten reminder that it is not all about giving up that Dr. Pepper or chocolate or cutting carbs. It is all about returning and nurturing your relationship with God. If giving up chocolate works for you during this season that's great. But maybe this year we pick some things up along this journey instead, such as kindness, compassion, care, and love."

## Youth Mid Winters at Mo-Ranch









January Session Hig

The Session met by Zoom on January 18th at 6:30 pm. Highlights included:

- 1. Opening in prayer and with a brief discussion on questions below:
  - a. What did you or your congregation learn over the last 22 months that you will continue in the future?
  - b. Can you name something the congregation did before the pandemic that you will not be doing in the future?
  - c. What do you miss the most from before the pandemic and how do you bring it into the future?
- 2. We received a thank you from Helotes House of Neighborly Services for our donation of 594 pounds of food worth \$1,063.26.
- 3. We examined and then welcomed new members Chuck and Betty Jean Hadden, who are transferring their membership from what was formally Good Shepherd Presbyterian.
- 4. We ended 2021 with a deficit of \$17,313.71, and while it is not good, it is a much lower number than originally anticipated. A reminder was shared that we approved the budget for 2022, but will be reviewing mid year.
- 5. Our committees shared how they continue to do the faithful and sacred work of the church, including:
  - a. posting of emergency numbers being posted outside each building on campus
  - b. First ever Foster Family Parent's Night Out hosted 27 children in attendance.
  - c.Off-Site Communion by Elders/Pastor was approved for 2022, with suggested liturgy included from Worship Committee.
  - d. Super Bowl of Caring is 2.13 and donations/food items will be collected; the Christmas Joy Offering collected \$298.24, and \$369.68 was collected for Habitat for Humanity as well as 20 children were served through our Angel Tree.
- 6. Committees worked to turn in budgets for Administrations review as we work to plan a budget for 2022.
- 7. We continue to follow CDC guidelines when it comes to Covid, and discussion was held in regards to the Omicrom varient. *The decision was made to continue meeting in person and encourage safety measures when gathering in person.*
- 8. Session voted to allow for an "Assistant Clerk" to be voted in place in case the Clerk of Session was unable to be present at a meeting. *Motion passed and in February, we will vote on who will fill the position.*
- 9. Rev. Walters shared she is under the weather and waiting for her COVID test results. Discussion and a plan were put in place for if Rev. Walters needed to miss Worship. Rev. Walters will be out 2/13 for vacation as she officiates her sister's wedding.
- 10. Covenant concerns were shared with our Session before we closed in prayer.

February Session Highlig

The Session met by Zoom on February 15th at 6:30 pm. Highlights included:

- 1. Opening in prayer and devotion by Reverend Katy Walters.
- 2. The Session approved the following items:
  - Recommendation from the Administration Committee to extend Worship Musician Deb Harrison's contact for another six months.
  - having Kay McCloskey and Cami Pace be representatives for the upcoming Mission Presbytery Meeting being held on March 5, 2022 via Zoom.
  - accepted the Treasure's Report as presented by Treasurer Saundra Davis.
- 3. Mission and Outreach shared the following updates:
  - the Food Pantry is moving to designated hours; Monday & Thursday, from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm.
  - 197 items and \$147 were collected for Souper Bowl of Caring; thank you to everyone for donating!
- 4. Other updates include:
  - Christian Education has five youth attending Mission Presbytery "Late-Winters" at Mo-Ranch, including one youth that is a part of leadership.
  - Fellowship is bringing back to life "The Shepherd Plan" for our congregation.
     Members of Fellowship and the Session will be shepherds caring for our congregation.
- 5. Pastor Katy expressed gratitude for Worship Committee taking on worship for the Sunday she was out. Thank you to Kay and Luke for sharing their camp/conference experience for worship.
- 6. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on March 2nd. Our theme is "Walking the Hard Road: Lent During Challenging Times." Devotionals will be emailed out weekly and there is a Challenge Calendar for people to participate in.
- 7. Covenant concerns were shared with our Session before we closed in prayer.
