


Our vision at New Hope Baptist Church is:





An encouraging word from the Davis home....

....since our last sharing with you. It has been such an odd time watching Gene move from being able to stay by himself to not being able to be alone and now preparing for Adult Day Care. He has been accepted to attend 3 days a week which will give me more dedicated time to my job and errands for home. Doing the shopping has become such a difficult time – 1. Remembering what I came for and 2. Keeping Gene from grabbing hot peppers from the produce and eating them (which he found to be very hot). I couldn't help but laugh and I told him they are going to weigh him before we leave to see how much more I owe. We are now at the level of care that he will ask for permission to go to the bathroom and 'where is it' to only find when he gets there, he can't remember why he went. He even has difficulty understanding having to wait for dinner to finish cooking. "I'm hungry now, I don't won't to wait".

To the more precious side of this illness – last Sunday when the choir began to sing Cornerstone, he was singing with them. And when Don called on him to have the closing prayer, my heart was overwhelmed. It was so precious to me. I have found that I am having more of those emotional moments than I have before. I must tell you though, we are still truly blessed. Folks, this is a terrible illness and whenever I hear someone say they were just diagnosed with dementia or Alzheimer, my heart sinks because having walked this, I know what's ahead. But I also have to Praise the Lord because there are others that are dealing with so much tougher days than we are. Don't get me wrong, it is truly hard but Ms. Lisa (a lady from my support group) shared how her mother is so bad (even though she thinks she is fine and needs no one) that she fights anyone who comes in to help. Even Hospice has difficulty helping out. So, I look at our situation and 1. Gene may complain about having to get a shower but he does and 2. I have a church family that helps every time we are there. His kidneys are holding their own but now we have to worry about the blood pressure. Keep praying-we are so very thankful!
