Project lets Lodges spread the word

Since 2004, the Elks have partnered with the Dictionary Project to ensure every student will enjoy the benefits of owning their own dictionary—an essential tool for a quality education.

The Elks alone have delivered more than 4 million copies of dictionaries to third graders. However, in recent years some schools have dissuaded Lodges from distributing dictionaries, because most students use the internet to look up words and definitions. Most of you will agree that books still play an important role in the education process—they stimulate the imagination.

Lodges that continue to participate in the Dictionary Project observed that children still appreciate receiving their own dictionary. If schools are hesitant to distribute the dictionaries, your next question is, "why?" If the Dictionary Project needs to be approved by the

school board, then get on their schedule.

The summer months are a perfect time to communicate with school administration staff not only about the Dictionary Project but also the other great Elks programs your Lodge conducts: Soccer Shoot, Hoop Shoot, Student of the Month/Year, Americanism Essay Contest, etc. If schools will not let your Lodge have a dictionary distribution, there are other ways. Consider having a distribution at your Lodge, at a public library, or at after-school programs in your area.

For those who have never participated in the Dictionary Program, visit their website at <u>dictionaryproject.org</u>. They offer a variety of dictionaries, and you can easily contact them by e-mail or phone to answer any of your questions.

Take the time to look into the Dictionary Project. Placing an influential book, like a dictionary, into a child's hands is very powerful—even in today's electronic world.




