

Saint Anthony renowned as the "father of monasticism," he was one of the first to lead an austere life of prayer and fasting in the solitude of the desert. To a fellow abbot, he gave the advice: "Don't trust in your own righteousness; practice moderation in food and talk; and don't worry about things done in the past." He died in 356 at the age of 105.

Saint Fabian was elected Pope in 236, led the Church for 14 years; an "incomparable man, the glory of whose death corresponded with the holiness of his life," shared by St. Cyprian to Pope St. Cornelius.

Saint Sebastian is said to have been a member of the Roman Army who was martyred around the year 300 during the persecutions of Diocletian; invoked as the patron of soldiers; he is also called upon by policemen and those who organize neighborhood watch programs.



Saint Agnes was martyred around the year 304; hailed throughout Church history as one of the holy virgin martyrs who gave up her life out of love for Christ, the bridegroom. In Latin, Agnes suggests "agnus," meaning "lamb." In Rome, there is a blessing of lambs on her feast day. In art, she is depicted with a lamb in her arms, evoking her humility, purity, and innocence.

Brothers and Sisters,

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. The readings for this season focus on Jesus at the beginning of his ministry. I usually don't take my Christmas tree down until after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord which we celebrated last Sunday and which marks the end of the Christmas season, when we return to Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time is one complete season that is "interrupted" so to speak, by Lent, the Triduum and Easter. The fact of the matter is that there really is no such thing as "ordinary" time. *All* of time is special in that all of time has been marked by the life, death and resurrection of Christ. It all belongs to Christ.



Today's readings reveal the transformative effect God has upon the world. In our first reading, Isaiah uses a simple image to convey to the people the effect of God's favor upon Israel. The prophet proclaims just as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride, so God rejoices in God's people. God takes to himself a people, Israel, and calls them "espoused" and "my delight."

St. Paul in our second reading speaks of the great variety of gifts that are given by the Holy Spirit. Gifts such as wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, mighty deeds and prophecy. These are but some of the gifts St. Paul writes about. These gifts transform each person differently and are to be used for the common good.

Since the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic, there have been periods when weddings have been subject to restrictions, for example the type of celebration allowed (indoor/outdoor) or the numbers permitted to attend. Reception or not. Yet for most people their wedding is the most important and life changing event they will experience. Careful planning of a wedding is a way to make a statement about who we are and what we hope for the future life of the couple. The Scriptures especially those of the Old Testament, use the image of a wedding to describe the relationship between God and God's people. In the time of Jesus, the people's longing for the coming of the Messiah was often expressed in terms of a wedding: the days of the Messiah would be a time of rejoicing, a wedding feast, with an abundance of food, wine and celebration. And so, St. John tells us the story of the wedding at Cana at the beginning of his gospel to indicate to us that God's blessings are being poured out on God's people.

Just as a wedding is a sign of who we are and what we hope for in life; love, security, good things-so the wedding at Cana is a sign of what God offers us-not simply the gifts of the Spirit that St. Paul mentions, but the fullness of life and love. What is asked of us is that we believe, as the disciples did, in Jesus' power to change our lives and to lead us to God. It is through faith in God that the "water" of our daily life can be transformed into something far more. Our lives gain a new meaning, a new quality if we enter into this covenant, this marriage with God, which Jesus makes possible. Faith and love are all that is needed for a good and loving marriage and all that God requires of us to have the fullness of life.

Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

The Catholic bishops of the United States have designated January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the “**Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children.**”

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, directs:

In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.

“A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world. Through special initiatives and in daily prayer, may an impassioned plea rise to God, the Creator and lover of life, from every Christian community, from every group and association, from every family and from the heart of every believer.”



“Por el amor de Dios, ¿se pueden callar?” Esta pregunta, sin duda, ha pasado por los labios de numerosos padres a lo largo de los años. Resulta tentador especular sobre quién exactamente, le ordenaba a Isaías que se callara. ¿Los vecinos? ¿Compañeros profetas? ¿La familia? No importa. Isaías dice con firmeza que, por el bien de Jerusalén y Sion, no se callará. A la inversa, en el conocido pasaje de la lectura del Evangelio de hoy, María reprende a su hijo para que rompa su silencio, para salvar la boda que pronto se va a quedar sin vino. Jesús responde con una acción profética, que señala la alegría milagrosa y abundante que fluye en el banquete de bodas celestial. Palabras proféticas, hechos proféticos: ambos surgen de un silencio roto.

LOS HIJOS PROBLEMÁTICOS

Los corintios parecen haber sido los hijos problemáticos de Pablo. Sus dos cartas a ellos son mucho más largas que cualquiera de sus otras cartas – dos, tres o cuatro veces más largas que algunas. Parece que, si los primeros cristianos de Corinto podían malinterpretar o hacer algo mal, lo hacían. Afortunadamente para nosotros, las dos cartas a los Corintios, aunque contienen mucho material didáctico o instructivo, también proporcionan algunos de los escritos más bien elaborados y llenos de gracia de Pablo. Esto es ciertamente cierto hoy en día, con una letanía de dones que el Espíritu concede a los fieles, incluso hasta el día de hoy. Pablo trata de calmar la disputa que parece haber existido, ya que los corintios trataban de reclamar un don u otro como más importante. Todos los dones proceden del mismo Espíritu, les recuerda Pablo, y los distintos dones se conceden en beneficio de la comunidad. Cuando los celos surgen en nuestro entorno, podemos recurrir a las ideas de Pablo para dejar de ser niños orgullosos y problemáticos.

EL NIÑO DESEADO

En la escena evangélica de Caná, vemos a María dirigirse a su propio hijo, Jesús. Tal vez recordaba la fuerza del Espíritu que había fluido en su vientre en el momento de su encarnación, lo que la llevó a discernir que seguramente él debía tener dones otorgados por el Espíritu que podrían ayudar en la inminente crisis de la boda. Al igual que en la Anunciación, es posible que al principio no estuviera completamente segura de cómo se produciría esto, pero en Caná se dirigió a Jesús con fe. Con fe, sus palabras, “hagan lo que él les diga”, se hicieron eco de su respuesta a Gabriel: “Hágase en mí lo que tú digas”. En la fe, ella sabe que cualquier palabra que la Palabra diga está destinada a traer otra irrupción del Espíritu, otra manifestación del reino de Dios. Y tiene razón. Su maravilloso hijo, según nos cuenta el evangelista Juan, realizó allí su primer prodigio y señaló la presencia de lo divino en lo cotidiano.

21 de enero - Santa Inés, virgen y mártir

22 de enero - **Día de oración por la protección legal de la criatura en el vientre materno**

San Antonio, conocido como el "padre del monacato", fue uno de los primeros en llevar una vida austera de oración y ayuno en la soledad del desierto. A un compañero abad, le dio el consejo: "No confíes en tu propia justicia; practica la moderación en la comida y en las conversaciones; y no te preocupes por las cosas hechas en el pasado"; murió en el año 356 a la edad de 105 años.

San Fabián fue elegido Papa en el año 236, dirigió la Iglesia durante 14 años; un "hombre incomparable, la gloria de cuya muerte se correspondió con la santidad de su vida", compartió San Cipriano con el Papa San Cornelio.

Se dice que **San Sebastián** era un miembro del ejército romano que fue martirizado hacia el año 300 durante las persecuciones de Diocleciano; se le invoca como patrón de los soldados; también es invocado por los policías y los que organizan programas de vigilancia vecinal.

Santa Inés fue martirizada hacia el año 304; aclamada a lo largo de la historia de la Iglesia como una de las santas vírgenes mártires que entregaron su vida por amor a Cristo, el esposo. En latín, Inés sugiere "agnus", que significa "cordero". En Roma, el día de su fiesta se bendicen corderos. En el arte, se la representa con un cordero en brazos, evocando su humildad, pureza e inocencia.
