

Saint Vincent Spanish-born poet; St Augustine preached sermons about his martyrdom, which was said to have been especially long and brutal; he died in 304 during the Diocletian persecution.

Saint Marianne Cope for thirty-five years cared for the lepers on the island of Moloka'i; one of her first tasks was caring for the dying Fr. Damien de Veuster, the "Apostle to the Lepers"; she died in 1918 and was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in October 2012.

Saint Francis de Sales bishop of Geneva; sought to bring many back to the Church through his personal life and writings; he died in 1622, declared a Doctor of the Church in 1877.

The Conversion of Saint Paul struck blind while on his way to Damascus to persecute followers of Christ, Saul converted and became the great apostle Paul.

Saint Timothy and Saint Titus were companions of Saint Paul and collaborators in the ministry to the Gentiles; Timothy overseer of the church of Ephesus and Titus of Crete.

Saint Angela Merici foundress of the Ursulines, the first teaching order of women religious in the Church; she sought re-evangelization of families through the education of future wives and mothers; she died in 1540.

Saint Tomas Aquinas a Dominican friar, his writings have formed students of theology for centuries; he died in 1274, declared a Doctor of the Church in 1567.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — The burdens that were once laid upon the people have been vanquished (Isaiah 8:23 — 9:3).

Psalm — The Lord guides and saves me (Psalm 27).

Second Reading — Paul exhorts the believers at Corinth: As there is one Christ, so too must there be no divisions among you. (1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17).

Gospel — After calling his first disciples, Jesus goes throughout Galilee teaching, proclaiming the gospel, and curing the people (Matthew 4:12-23 [12-17]).

Brothers and Sisters,

On this 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, we celebrate “The Sunday of the Word of God.” In today’s celebration we recognize the centrality of God’s word in our lives and in the life of the Church. Pope Francis instituted the Sunday of the Word of God on September 30, 2019 and directed it be held every year on the third Sunday of Ordinary Time. Scripture is central to our faith and Christ is the center of the Bible, both the Old and the New Testaments, for as John wrote, “In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God, and the Word was God” (Jn. 1:1). It is no chance occurrence that Pope Francis instituted this celebration on September 30th as that is the feast day of St. Jerome who translated most of the Bible into Latin and who wrote: “Ignorance of the scriptures is ignorance of Christ.”



In today’s 1st reading the prophet Isaiah speaks about a king who would come to bring light into a world of darkness. Jesus is understood as that light. He is the one who offers hope to the suffering and sorrowful people of the world. Jesus is the one who by his very life, offers salvation and destroys the evil that would stand in the way of humanity’s salvation. Paul in our 2nd reading exhorts the people of Corinth and us with a timely reminder: no one possesses the gospel, no one should presume to monopolize Christ’s name. To divide the Church into rival, jealous cliques would be to break apart the body of Him who unites all. To follow a leader in a particular way, to ban expressions of faith differing from our own would be to ignore the salvation that comes to us from the one cross of Christ.

Today’s gospel from Matthew serves as the beginning to the chapters from Matthew that will be read during the Sundays of Ordinary Time. Today we are called to become fishers of men. The first part of the gospel is a quotation from the prophet Isaiah in today’s first reading. The first disciples called-Simon, Andrew, James and John-were all fishermen. Fishing was one of the most stable occupations of first-century Galilee. Jesus comes from Galilee, a place that was until that time inhabited by Gentiles and held in low esteem by Jews. Jesus begins to teach with the proclamation: “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.” There is much that can be said about what the coming of the kingdom means, and Matthew will lead us to understand this in the weeks to come. Yet already in today’s gospel we see that it calls for a change. When Jesus calls Simon, Andrew, James and John, they immediately leave their way of life to follow Jesus into the great unknown. No longer are they assured of being able to put food on the table or money in their pockets. However, as they traveled around Galilee, they were rewarded by seeing firsthand the wonders that Jesus did. So it is for us, the coming of the kingdom will mean letting go of something, but also the discovery of something new.







SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD—1/23/2023***Feeding Your Family
Food for the Soul***

Recent surveys have shown that few Catholics read the Bible on their own or as a family. But what better place is there to encounter the person of Jesus Christ than in God's Word? As St. Jerome once noted, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ."

The Church continually invites us to return to God's Word. For when we pray with the Bible—personally and in our homes—our encounter with the living Word of God is not a mere intellectual exercise but a spiritually nourishing feast. As we find ways to share God's Word in our homes we will experience firsthand what the Second Vatican Council means in Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation (Dei Verbum) when it states that "in the sacred books the Father who is in heaven comes lovingly to meet his children, and talks with them. And such is the force and power of the Word of God that it can serve the Church as her support and vigor, and the children of the Church as strength for their faith, food for the soul, and a pure and lasting fount of spiritual life" (no. 21, in Flannery).

TERCER DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

REUNIENDO DISCÍPULOS

Para introducir los inicios del ministerio de Jesús en el Evangelio de Mateo de hoy, el evangelista cita el pasaje de Isaías 9, que se nos presenta con más detalle en nuestra primera lectura. Isaías reconoce las tinieblas de la opresión por la conquista de la región de Galilea por parte de Asiria, pero recuerda a su pueblo la esperanza que Dios le ofrece. Mateo, escribiendo en tiempos del Imperio Romano, siglos después, señala a Jesús y su proclamación del reino de los cielos, para derribar toda forma de opresión. Las estructuras de poder como Asiria o Roma se basan en el miedo, el control y la desconfianza para sostenerse. Pero el reino de Dios debe estar saturado del amor de Dios, la libertad y la confianza mutua. Jesús comenzó reuniendo a un grupo de discípulos. Cuando Jesús reúna a su comunidad de discípulos de forma similar en nuestra iglesia de hoy, nuestro amor mutuo y nuestra atención a todos los demás pueden hacer que este reino de Dios sea visible para todos.

LLAMADO A LA COMUNIDAD

El Evangelio de hoy de Mateo esboza los movimientos iniciales del ministerio público de Jesús. La detención de Juan el Bautista indica que ha llegado la hora de Jesús. Sus primeras acciones incluyen la llamada de sus primeros discípulos y la proclamación del reino de los cielos. Jesús reúne primero una comunidad, a la que puede formar gradualmente para que se convierta en una prueba viviente de este reino venidero. Su predicación, que comienza unos versículos más tarde en el Sermón de la Montaña, no es sólo una guía esencial para la vida de cada individuo, sino para la vida dentro de una comunidad de sus seguidores.

Para la mayoría de nosotros, que vivimos en una sociedad altamente individualizada, puede resultar muy desafiante escuchar esta historia de ser convocados en comunidad, comprometidos a aprender juntos y unos de otros. Nuestras parroquias y comunidades cristianas tienen que ser lugares seguros para que podamos abrir nuestros corazones a los demás, aprendiendo el Camino de Jesús, y compartiendo este Camino con los demás.

UNIDOS EN CRISTO

En su carta a los Corintios, Pablo aborda muchos temas pastorales, y comienza con cuestiones de división sobre el liderazgo. Oímos hablar de campos rivales de lealtad para varios líderes y predicadores: Pablo mismo, Apolo o Cefas. Pablo teme que la comunidad haya perdido el centro de la fe, es decir, el propio Cristo. La comunidad debe estar unida en mente y propósito bajo Cristo.

Muchos experimentan hoy en día una división muy similar. Algunos cristianos dicen en efecto: "Yo pertenezco a... (ponga el nombre de su predicador, teólogo o líder favorito), y los que no lo hacen no son de fiar". La diversidad de pensamiento y antecedentes es esencial para la vitalidad de la comunidad cristiana, pero aquí Pablo describe una división que oculta el mensaje de Cristo. Oculta la llamada de Cristo a la caridad y a la tolerancia hacia todos. Esta división oculta la verdad de que todos estamos al pie de la cruz, una cruz que revela nuestro propio quebranto y nuestra necesidad de misericordia.




