Erickson Balgos, a player from Nueva Vizcaya (The CHAMPION team in the JV division) shared that he was thankful to the Lord for sparing his life from a motorcycle incident before so that he will be able to attend camp, he said that now that he accepted Christ as His Savior, he is sure that when he die, he will go to heaven.



After camp, the MVP of our Paranaque tournament, John Melchor Palmon went to church with us at Lighthouse.



That same Sunday, one of the JV players from Pangasinan, Githro Paroca, sent me a message, he said that he is thankful to the Lord that he met us and was able to join camp and that through our ministry, he found Christ who is able to bring real change in his life. He has so many questions about the Bible and he even said that after camp, his family was shocked to see him reading his Bible.
