
#### Vesper Got Lost: PopPop was Frantic!

### **OVDBA Show Highlights**

Summer started with OVDBA members convening at the Wayne County Fairgrounds for the 2024 Ohio Valley Dexter Cattle Breeders Association's Dexter Cattle Show. The event began on Friday, May 17th, featuring a range of educational classes designed for both prospective Dexter owners and existing Dexter breeders. In the arena, Mark Muir gave a presentation on "Pasture Rangeland and Forage", followed by a cheesemaking demonstration by Dan and Cindy Edgington. The educational classes concluded with a Q&A session on registration and genotyping led by Santiago Lizarraga.

Simultaneously, eager youth awaited the Youth Scavenger Hunt, eyeing the youth table for the fun to begin. Children lined up to receive their first clue, embarking on a search through the barn for specific farm names, COWS, individuals. After deciphering riddles and engaging with amused adults, the youth excitedly explored their backpacks filled with treats like candy, stickers, lanyards, and drink bottles.



Transitioning to a calmer activity, attendees gathered in the arena with their cattle for the Showmanship Clinic. Later, everyone enjoyed a barbecued dinner in the cafeteria, courtesy of sponsor Mark Muir. Appetites satisfied, the crowd returned to witness the highly anticipated cow costume contest, featuring a diverse



array of imaginative outfits from participants: Thing 1 and Thing 2, a miniature Paul Bunyan with his blue "ox", a not-so-cowardly lion, and a suspicious looking taco -to name a few! However, it was Sophia Rocca dressed as Little Bo Peep, Sam Sears portraying Bob Ross, and Roman Lizarraga as a pirate who captured the judges' hearts with 1st, 2nd and 3rd places. The evening ended with a refreshing treat: a sundae bar provided by Edginaton Farms.

The following day started early, with cattle receiving a final wash as the sun rose. The smell of freshly brewed coffee

wafted through the barn, alerting busy exhibiters that Wise Acres' complimentary breakfast of coffee, juice, yogurt, fruit, pastries, muffins, and granola bars was ready to be enjoyed.



In the arena, beneath the flag's shadow, "The National Anthem" sung by youth member Mario Lizarraga, signaled the start of the show. First, the Milking Class was brought in. This was followed by Youth Showmanship Classes (Senior, Junior, and Peewee). A special shoutout to Josiah Lizarraga and Jocie Wilt for their 1st and 2nd placement in the Senior Showmanship Class! In the Junior Class, congratulations went to Sam Sears and Clara Harmon. Awesome job, OVDBA youth members!

The show briefly paused at this point for youth announcements and special recognitions. Senior Showmanship Class winners were surprised with special educational scholarships of \$1000 and \$500 from a generous donor, then an Award of Excellence was presented to Sophia Rocca for her completion of all

assigned youth projects. With mounted anticipation, giveaway heifer and steer were retrieved as tickets were shaken in a canister. A willing bystander reached in the container and pulled out a ticket for giveaway heifer Whittington's Samie. The youth nervously waited to hear if it was their name that would be drawn. "Alaina Baughman!" As cheers subsided and an excited Alaina beamed at her new heifer, a second name was drawn for giveaway steer Royal



Fare Garrett: "Jennilyn Mink!" With more cheers and more beaming (and a few happy tears) both recipients posed with their very own heifer and steer.

The show resumed with the Adult Showmanship Class, where JR Lizarraga secured first place, closely followed by DeAnna Baughman in second place. The show then moved on to open classes. Cow calf pairs, heifers, then cows. With a slap to the rump of the cow, Judge John Paulin announced the Grand Champion Female: *EF* 



Grace, followed by Reserve Champion Timberview DS Ali. This was followed by steer classes. In customary fashion, the grand and reserve champion steers were announced with a rump slap: SBR Tow

Mater followed by JK Comet. Then came bull classes with NMF Hero gaining the title of Grand Champion Bull, followed by Whittington's Game On winning the title of Reserve Grand Champion Bull. The show closed out with Edgington Farms winning Supreme Champion Dexter with EF Grace.
