<u>Leader:</u> Dearest Christ, we gather in thanks and praise for the inheritance you have granted us. <u>PEOPLE:</u> Help us to live into the purposes you have destined for us -that we might accomplish all the things you intend for us.

<u>Leader:</u> And forgive us, we pray, when we fail to listen to your counsel and will, Lord. Strengthen us to keep our hope resting upon you -that we might live for your glory.

<u>PEOPLE:</u> Then we will hear and repeat the Word of Truth afresh -sharing the Gospel of Salvation through the power of The Holy Spirit.

<u>Leader:</u> May we remain sealed as YOUR People, Holy One -honoring and walking in the Redemptive Power YOU have passed down to us as an inheritance from the saints who have gone before us.

<u>PEOPLE:</u> Let us also be continually grateful for the faith of our sisters and brothers -praying with and for one another; and seeking YOUR Wisdom and Revelation for those who have yet to know Jesus and the Hope to which he calls us all. Enlighten the eyes of their hearts, that they might see YOU.

<u>Leader:</u> For the riches of the glorious inheritance YOU offer YOUR saints is immeasurable, and the power YOU pour out upon us is oh-so-great.

<u>PEOPLE:</u> YOU put that power to work in our Lord, Christ-Jesus when YOU raised him from the dead and seated him at YOUR Right Hand in the Heavenly places.

Leader: Anoint us to remember that he is far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named -not only in this age but also in the age to come. PEOPLE: And grant us mercy, we humbly ask, when we do not acknowledge that YOU put all things under the feet of our Master and Savior. Remind us that he is the Head over all things for The Church (which is his Body -the fullness of The One who fills all in all). Leader: With all of these things in mind, we lift-up before YOU now a celebration of remembrance for The Great Cloud of Witnesses who have gone on before us...
