


### COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE

### In 2023 we were proud to be a part of the following projects:

- Construction of a new school in Dani, Mali.
- Construction of the second story of a community center in Muenala, Ecuador.
- Construction of an eco-trail in the community of Gualsaqui, Ecuador.
- IT and WIFI upgrades to the computer labs at the schools in Tangalí, Quichinche, and Gualsaqui, Ecuador.
- Construction of a community bathroom and playground enhancements in the community of Gualapuro, Ecuador.
- Painted three murals at a school in Otavalo, Ecuador.
- Built a roof over the Ecua-volley court in Agualongo, Ecuador.
- Painted the elementary school and built a speed bump in Motilón Chupa, Ecuador.
- Construction of a wheelchair accessible ramp at the school in Quichinche, Ecuador.
- Built a roof over the recycling center at a school in Otavalo.
- Construction of a large outdoor cement patio at the school in Cambugan.
- Painted the school in Padre Chupa, Ecuador.



### EDUCATION

### In 2023 we were proud to be a part of the following projects:

- Secondary education scholarships in Ecuador that allowed 100 students to attend high school. 16 students graduated this year!
- Higher education scholarships in Ecuador that allowed 25 students to attend universities and technical institutes. 5 students graduated this year!
- Professional school scholarships in Mali through the Dr. Ash B. Varma, M.D. Scholarship Program that allowed 38 students to study for professional work that is needed in their region. 8 students graduated this year!
- Tommo So Literacy program for 314 women in Mali.
- Leadership workshops for 100 women in Mali.
- Student Mothers program in Mali for 10 young mothers.
- Support for 100 internally displaced children to attend school in Bandiagara, Mali.
- Summer school program for 25 students in Ecuador.
- Support for teachers at the elementary schools in Yarou Plateau, Andjine, Kansongo, and Sol-Dogon, Mali.
- Support for a music and art teacher at the elementary school in Urkusiki, Ecuador.
- Taught one course for Whitman College, on Gender and Change in Rural Mali.

# ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION AND FOOD SECURITY

### In 2023 we were proud to be a part of the following projects:

- Creation of two new grain banks in Mali.
- Support for the Olouguelemo Environmental Association, which led the following projects:
  - Created a third tree nursery to raise trees for reforestation and provided training on germination and grafting techniques to the managers of all three tree nurseries.
  - Planted 2,026 trees in a reforestation campaign.
  - Built more than 13,500 meters worth of stone contour lines to prevent erosion and retain water in the soil.
  - Practiced assisted natural regeneration on 19,521 trees.
  - Made 252 improved cookstoves.
  - Expanded 35 ponds, which make it possible to garden and to raise livestock.
  - Protected 1,222 hectares of forest.
- Food support for 100 internally displaced families in Bandiagara, Mali so their children can attend school.
- Planted gardens in the community of Cambugan, Ecuador and at the Saminay school in Inguincho, Ecuador.



"The importance of the protected forest is just endless for us herders, because if we protect the areas, and we build stone contour lines in the areas, in two or three years the soil becomes deep. It grows a lot of grass, so we don't need to go elsewhere to keep the herds. We can keep the herds in our environment without any losses or fear."

## HEALTH CARE

### In 2023 we were proud to be a part of the following projects:

- One-day medical clinics in 5 Ecuadorian communities.
- One-day basic medical clinics in 7 Malian communities.
- Community Health and Well-being Program in Ecuador:
  - 616 patients received support with medical care.
  - 14 months' supply of baby formula was delivered to 2 infants.
  - 10 patients received support with vision care.
  - 4 patients accessed surgeries.
  - 3 patients received glasses.
  - 1 patient received a prosthetic eye.
- Malian scholars worked as interns in 9 health centers and 2 hospitals.

### INCOME GENERATION

### In 2023 we were proud to be a part of the following projects:

- Five new women's associations received startup funding to start businesses in market gardening, selling dried fish, making seasoning balls, and transforming cotton into cloth.
- 6 tailors who graduated through the Dr. Ash B. Varma, M.D. Scholarship Program in Mali received materials to start their own workshops.
- Capacity building workshop for the community tourism project of "Aroma Caliente" association in El Juncal, Ecuador.



# WATER RESOURCES

### In 2023 we were proud to be a part of the following projects:

- Completion of a new potable water system in Inguincho, Ecuador.
- Installed sewer pipes in Panecillo, Ecuador.
- Improvement and securing of 3 wells in Mali.
- Expansion of 35 ponds. We provided food support and tools so that residents of 11 villages could expand 35 ponds, thus conserving more water that they can use for gardening and livestock.


