God is Still Speaking





He has brought down the powerful from their thrones and lifted up the lowly (Luke 1:52)

If you were able to be in church on the morning of Christmas Eve you witnessed the baptism of two young women. As they prepared for baptism, it occurred to me that remembering our baptism may be the best resolution for the new year.

What if we all went into 2024 determined to live out our baptismal promises? Whenever a person is baptized or confirmed they make promises to God and to the Church universal. (When we baptize babies the parents make those promises on behalf of the child.)

The first thing we ask at baptism is if someone wants to be part of the faith and family of God. What if this year, we recommitted ourselves to spending time with God either by ourselves, or in community at church? What if we committed ourselves to doing something new in the church community we had not done before, like joining a fellowship, study, or church board?

The next thing we ask those being baptized is if they renounce the power of evil and desire new life in Christ. What if we took that on for our task in 2024? What might it mean to renounce evil and turn toward the power of Christ in our daily life? We'd first have to define evil, which we can't do in this space. But what if we rededicated ourselves to renouncing oppression like poverty, hopelessness, and exclusion? We find those almost everywhere in Rock Springs and the world beyond. How can we resist those? What if we sought just one answer to this in 2024?

Finally, we ask those being baptized if they profess Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. It's no small ask. Professing Jesus as Lord means accepting Jesus has spiritual and social power on earth and heaven. Professing Jesus' power is a radical thing to do; it suggests that there is a power more powerful than those who think they have power in the world. Sometimes just suggesting that the powerful are not as powerful as they think can still get us into trouble. In the UCC we call that "good trouble." It is the kind that Mary foresaw as she awaited the birth of Jesus. But what if we did that, too? What if we realized that God's vision of the world, and our lives, was more important than any vision a human being had about it?

My New Year's wish is that we all might ponder and live out our baptismal promises. Pastor Kelli



Would you like to Serve as a Deacon?

Our Deacons help lead the worship life of our congregation.
They meet monthly to review plans for special services and special Lent/Advent events. They ensure that we have worship leaders and fellowship hosts. They check our worship candles to make sure the candles have enough oil, light the candles prior to services, and put them out at the end of services. They also turn on the sound system and hand out bulletins. Usually the deacons take turns doing this each Sunday, and sometimes they each do this for a month at a time.

We have some people who have agreed to serve as Deacons for the coming year. (We even have enough Deacons to meet the requirements of our by-laws.) However, experience tells us it is always better to have more Deacons. If you are interested in serving as a Deacon, or if you simply would be willing to do the Deacon duties on a Sunday but prefer not to serve on the board, please let Pastor Kelli know.
