

"Who's Right?" I was asked this once by a youth while in a very long car ride from Atlanta to St. Louis for a Mission Trip. I was with a great group of high school students who were all so different from one another it made your brain hurt a bit. But there we were, driving on a long stretch of highway while they debated "who was right" in...scripture. One of my youth had a Nigerian preacher father and knew her scripture just about better than any pastor. She and another youth, a young man who I believe is on track to be a lawyer, were arguing which scripture was "right" when some of the verses seemed to contradict one another.

I was perfectly content to be on a fly on the wall, when I heard them ask, "Hey Katy, who's right?"

"Well," I began, setting cruise control and buying time while I thought of how to respond. I finally started with, "I think you're both right." As I heard the intake of breath from them to argue, I continued on.

"I think one of the gifts from the Holy Spirit is each and everyone's ability to hear God's Divine Word." Always looking for an opportunity to teach, I added, "And remember, while we believe the authority of scripture to be wholly upon God, we understand that the Spirit is at work through our hearing and understanding of God's Word."

(I was summing up what the Westminster Confession of Faith says: "The whole counsel of God concerning all things necessary for his own glory, man's salvation, faith and life, is either expressly set down in Scripture, or by good and necessary consequence may be deduced from Scripture: unto which nothing at any time is to be added, whether by new revelations of the Spirit, or traditions of men. Nevertheless, we acknowledge the inward illumination of the Spirit of God to be necessary for the saving understanding of such things as are revealed in the Word: and that there are some circumstances concerning the worship of God, and government of the church, common to human actions and societies, which are to be ordered by the light of nature, and Christian prudence, according to the general rules of the Word, which are always to be observed. See why I summed it up?!?)


belly, I admit I don't need to know every single detail of Jonah's story to believe God is at work when prophets run away and don't listen, and I believe, as we hear time and time again, our God is a saving God.

So who's right? I'd say, those who read scripture and apply it to their living to the glory of God and benefit of God's creation. And too, I think those who allow God's Word to take root in their heart and change their lives...or even let it rule their lives!

And how we hear it, understand it, might be different from someone from a different church, town, state, or country. I think that's pretty cool, as it allows us to be in conversation and allows for the Spirit to be at work so that we might grow and change in understanding who God is.

At the end of the day, I'll be honest, it doesn't really matter to me who's right and who's wrong. What matters is that we remember who's Word we're reading and what that demands of us.




