ZAP! JUICE GIVES ELECTRIFYING FORUM SHOW!

"Lightning struck the Ontario Palace Forum last night. It was Juice Newton! Shining all over in black satin tights and a pink satin jacket, Newton streaked on-stage with her five-man band and rocked into "One Touch," then she slowed it down a bit for her No. 1 Country Hit, "You Make Me Want To Make You Mine," but at no point in the evening did a change in tempo mean a drop in her electric energy level. Strutting and dancing around the stage, Newton has straight-on determination about her delivery that's a pleasure to watch. And what a voice! The lady has power pipes! She just sort of gets up there and wails, going like quicksilver and hitting every note right between the ears. Vocally, she's got a range to rival the Rockies! There's no faking or falsetto fooling around to her rich, full singing. Newton sings "true" tackling stuff in concert other singers would never attempt outside the technical protection of the studio. When she put her guitar aside to sing "Break It To Me Gently," you could actually hear people in the audience gasp with wonder. Burnin' and yearnin' came across at their poignant best, and it was a perfect moment! Newton's hold on an audience has a lot to do with bliss!

NEWTON SINGS WITH PASSION, POWER!

"All this crossover talk of rock meeting country music is illuminating, but ultimately unnecessary where Juice Newton is concerned. On the strength of yesterday's outstanding concert at Assinibois Downs, Newton can have it all. With pipes, passion, the likes of which these ears haven't heard since the mighty Claudia Schmidt was here last year, Newton was superb! . . funny, frisky, altogether committed performer who won the hearts and hands of 6,445 music and/or horse lovers. Her fivepiece band was on the case too, and the two ace guitarists in particular, were given plenty of room to play as the star bopped about the stage. 'I'm So Hurt' was an especially exciting result, and with Newton singing every watt of vocal power from the heart outwards, it sounded like Patsy Cline meeting the Big Beat. The droll way with pathos, which seems to be a Nashville tradition, was there in songs as different as the energetic 'One Touch,' such as the pretty, quiet, 'This Old Flame Went Out' and a couple of times cooling the medium with some blues persuasion, and so on. Everything convinced, including her version of Stealers Wheels' 'Stuck In The Middle With You,' which rocked with authority. Her broken-heart songs hurt! On one, the first of two encores, her soaring vocal bravado drew cheers well before the song finished. As an added treat, TV monitors provided an intimate close-up of the singer and she played beautifully to the cameras.

Newton's records, at least the ones this reviewer has heard, give scant evidence of what a wonderful instrument her voice is. Perhaps her latest album has caught that power . . . She had sung for nearly an hour, and very well, but still the sweet strength of Newton's voice on the songs was a fresh surprise. Juice Newton had pleased her fans with fine versions of her big hits and she and her band had captured the crowd through an exhausting display of energy. Newton's lovely voice had converted the skeptical!'

Despite a merciless sun that punched temperatures on stage well over 100 degrees and turned the Forum Amphitheater at Worlds of Fun into a sweatbox, Miss Newton, and her band, showed the same tenacity and perseverance that has marked her roller-coaster musical career for more than a decade. For almost an hour, Newton executed her well-paced, intelligent set with yeoman-like precision. Her pixieish charm and energy . . maintained by frequent douses with ice water . . . even managed to get the estimated 2,200 persons, that were undoubtedly fused to their seats by the heat, up and rocking with a few well-chosen wa-oo-wop-wops on "Sail Away". For most of the songs, however, the primarily family-oriented audience was content to sit quietly, wiping perspiration away, and gently swaying and tapping their feet to the movement. The less movement, the better! But that didn't deter Miss Newton or her band. Miss Newton has replaced more than half of her touring group, resulting in as tight an ensemble as she has worked with in many years.
