## Setting a plan helps incoming officers

A new year beginning is the perfect time to reflect on the goals you set for your Lodge, in addition to establishing new goals for 2023.

Setting goals can help us move forward as officers and build bonds that will carry on forever. Create a road map for your team to follow by introducing new ideas while setting goals for your officers to follow. The next corps of officers will continue your ideas as an Exalted Ruler and as a team of officers. You might have three months left as a leader, so the incoming officers need to be included in the goal setting. Working together to achieve these goals helps us define what we can be in Elkdom.

We have determined that, on average, most Lodges have only been reporting a fraction of their charitable data. Using the calendar from your monthly newsletter should always be the guide to completing your report. We established a new monthly Government Relations report that asks specific questions reminding Lodge Chairs there is more work that needs to be done, like improving your relationship with your local government.

It's a lot of work—this Lodge Committee cannot be run by one person. Every Lodge Chairperson should enter your monthly contributions into CLMS themselves; your Lodge Secretary has the discretion to make this available to you. This will save your Lodge Secretary valuable time and energy and the Chairperson will have a better idea of his or her job. Every Lodge Chairperson should be sending the last three-year totals (easily found on elks.org) to their local government. Every mayor, council member, and county supervisor needs to know how much your Lodge has contributed. Your report should include all the grant and scholarship opportunities that ENF has to offer.

## Washington Lodge makes Impact in childhood literacy

The Community Investments Program offers Elks an opportunity to address the most pressing needs in their community. Last year, more than 80% of Elks Lodges used at least one CIP grant as the ENF awarded more than \$11 million.

But CIP grants are worth more than their dollar value. These grants can turn Lodges into a community force. Every \$1,000 granted last year put nearly five Elks in the field, volunteering more than 26 hours on community service projects.

"When we pair our resources with passionate and dedicated volunteers," said ENF Assistant Director Debbie Doles at the 2022 Elks National Convention Opening Ceremony, "the result is powerful."

The ENF reignited its Impact Grant program after a brief COVID-induced hiatus, and 56 Lodges were given up to \$10,000 to implement large charitable projects in their communities. Bremerton, WA Lodge No. 1181 used its Impact Grant to be a force in its community.

Bremerton Lodge's Impact Grant project, Reading for Readiness, helps kids develop reading comprehension, disaster preparedness, and social-emotional skills like anger management, making friends, and handling worries. So far, they have already given 4,000 books to kids living in households below the poverty line.

Bremerton Lodge's Grants Coordinator and Exalted Ruler, Heather Beal, and another Lodge Member, Gus Holstein, sat down with the ENF to talk about the grant project in a video that premiered at the convention's Opening Ceremony.

"We're so proud of the work the Lodges are doing with our grants, and there are a lot," Doles said in her speech. "For those who aren't taking advantage of all the available grants, I urge you to take heed of what Gus and Heather said at the end of that video: Find a need in your community that's not already being met and use our grants to do something about it."

The Elks National Foundation allocated nearly \$16 million this year to fund the Community Investments Program. Lodges meet local needs through grants that offer Elks opportunities to serve their community in ways that will raise the Lodge's profile, energize the membership, encourage former members to return to the fold, and gain the notice of people who want to be part of an organization that's doing great things. 
